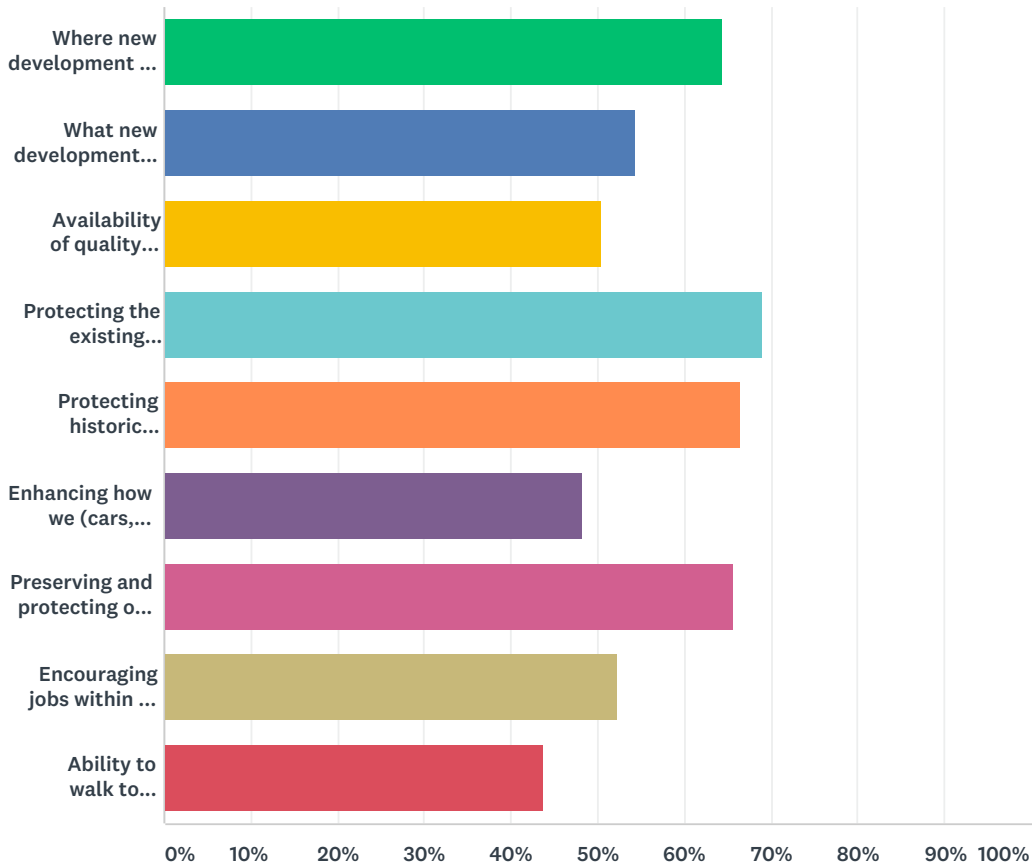


Q1 The General Plan addresses several challenges in the City. Which of the following are important to you? Check all that apply.

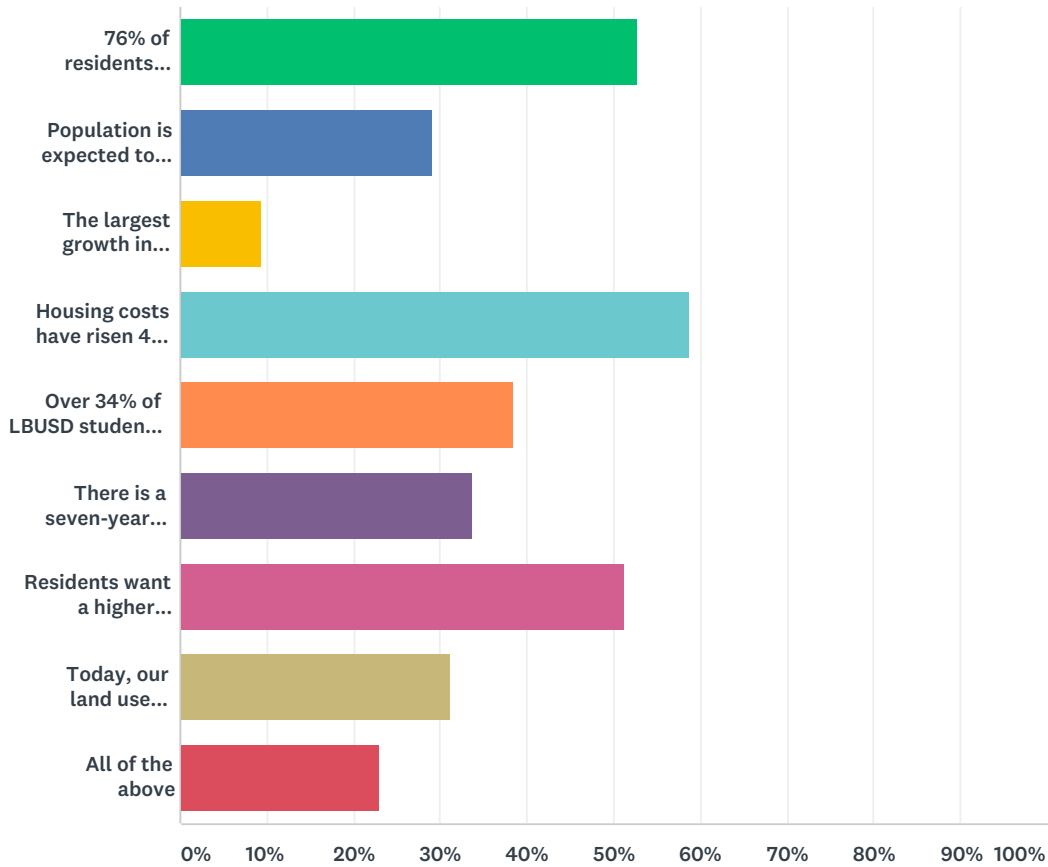

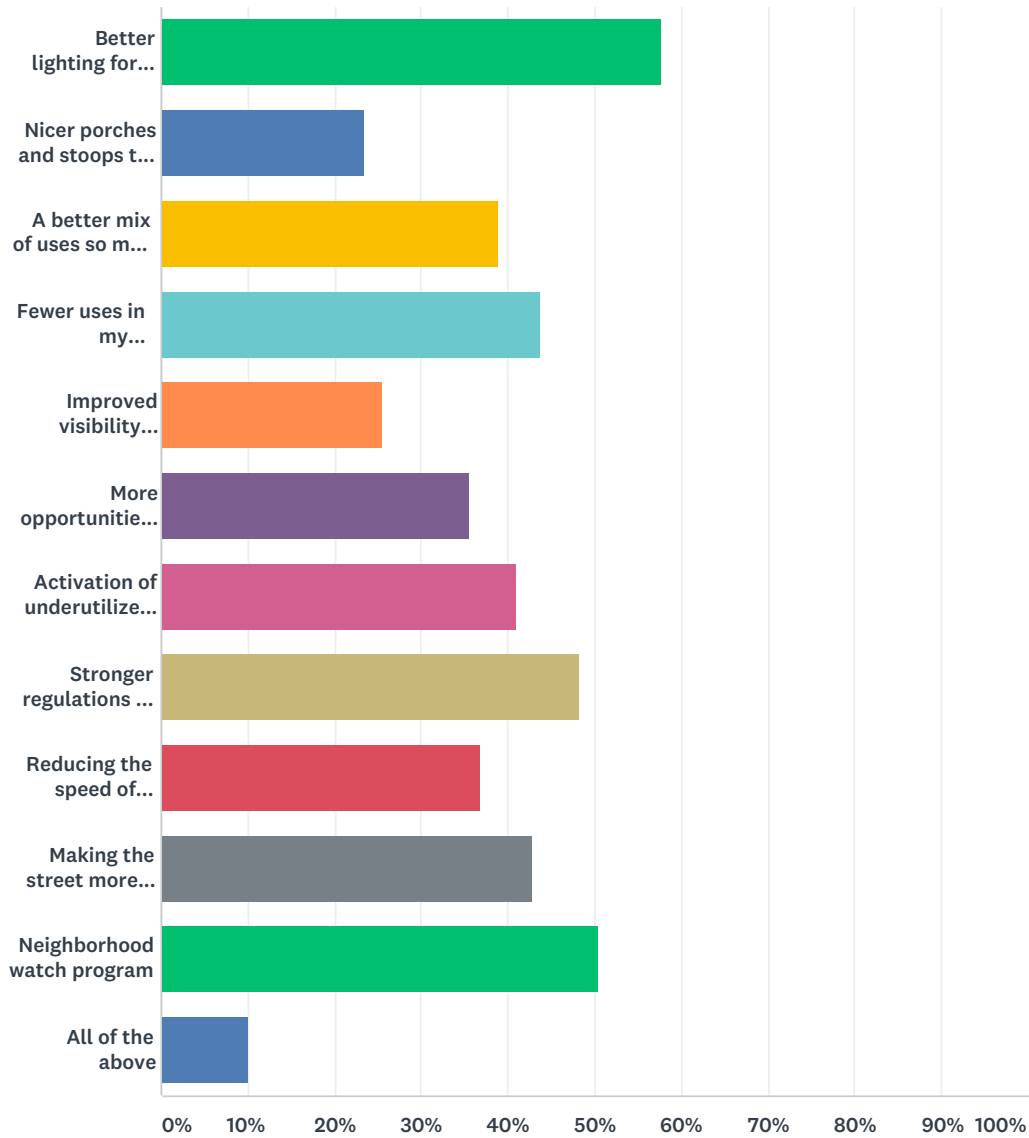

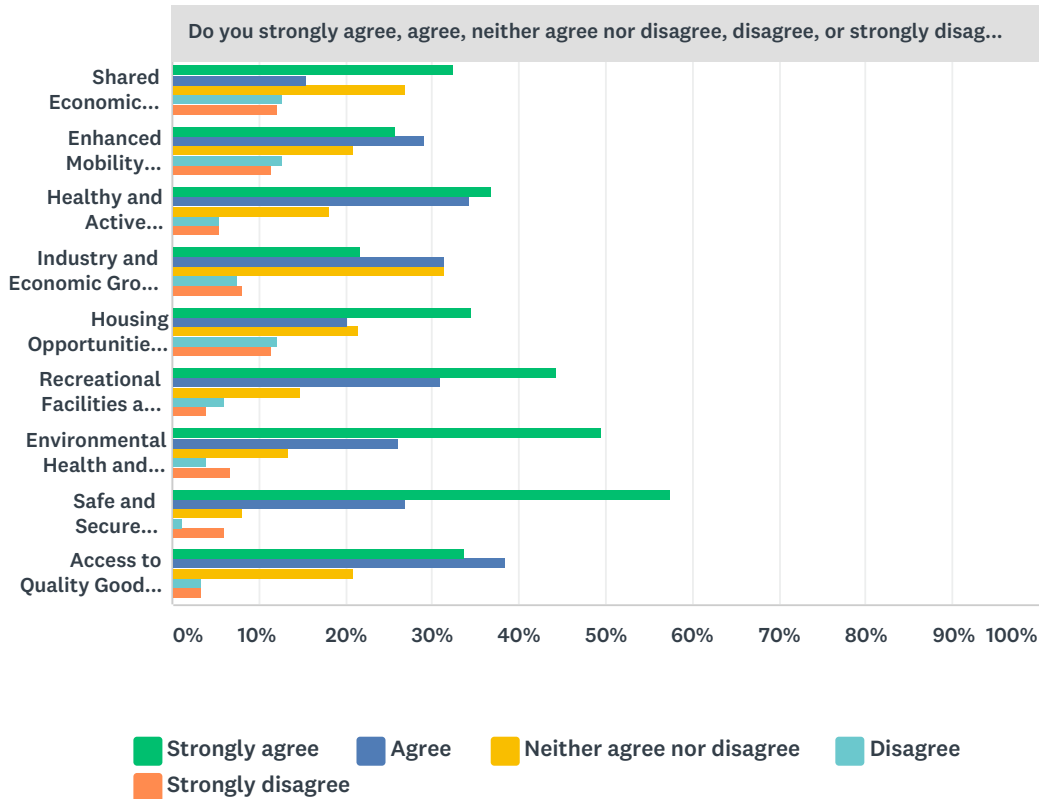

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## Q5 Which of the following goals is the most important?

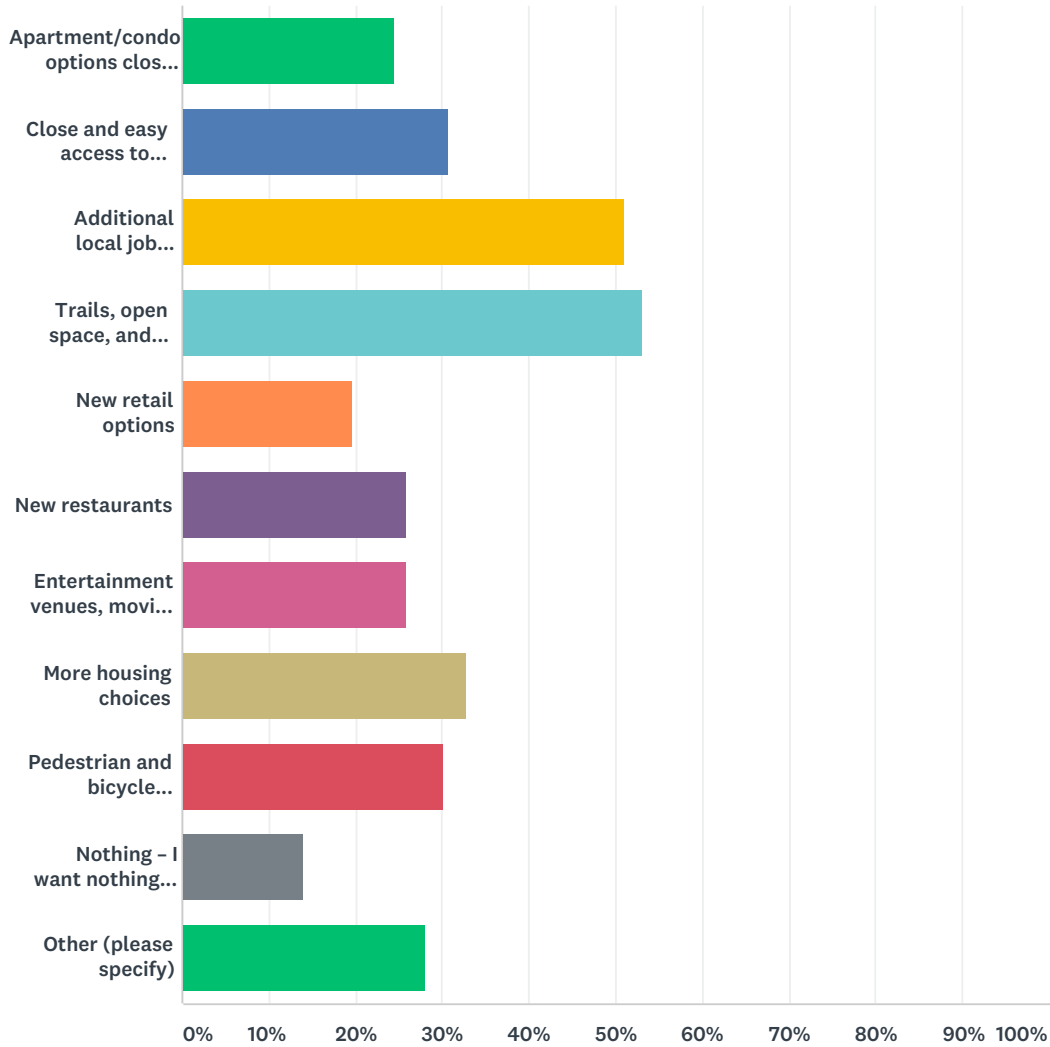

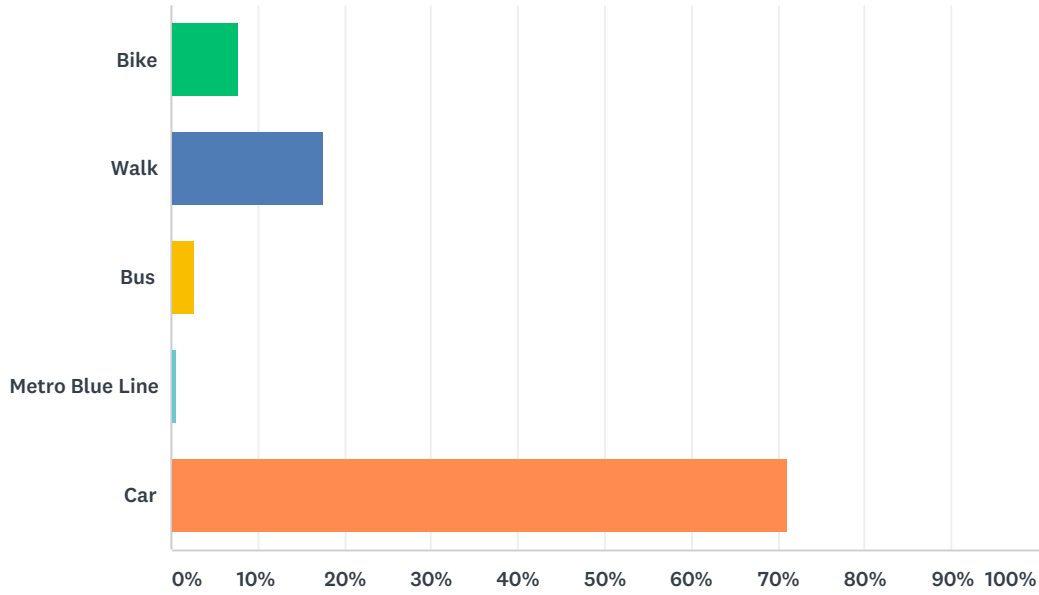

### Q8 Which of the following do you use the most?

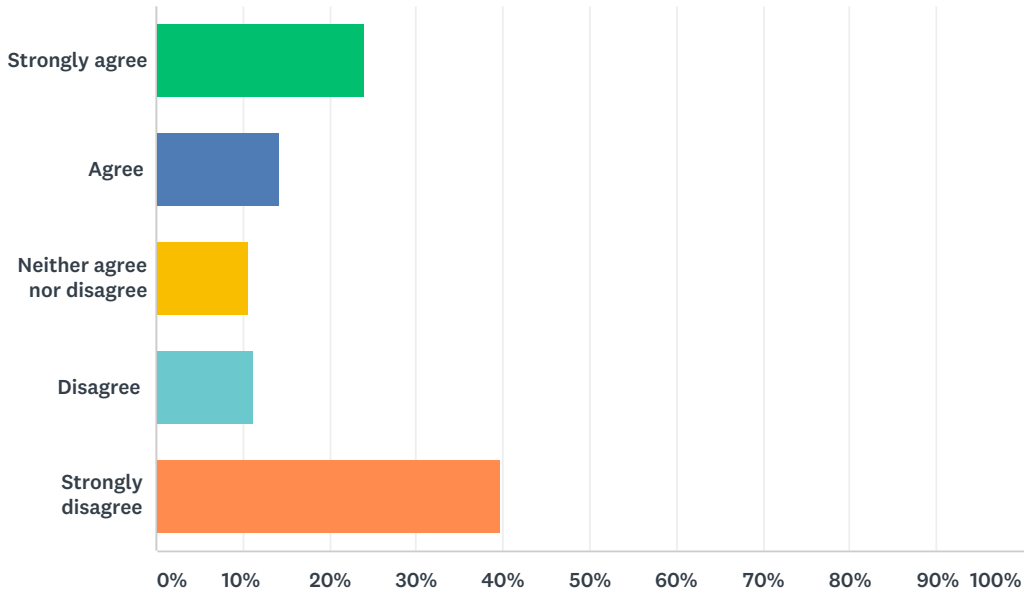

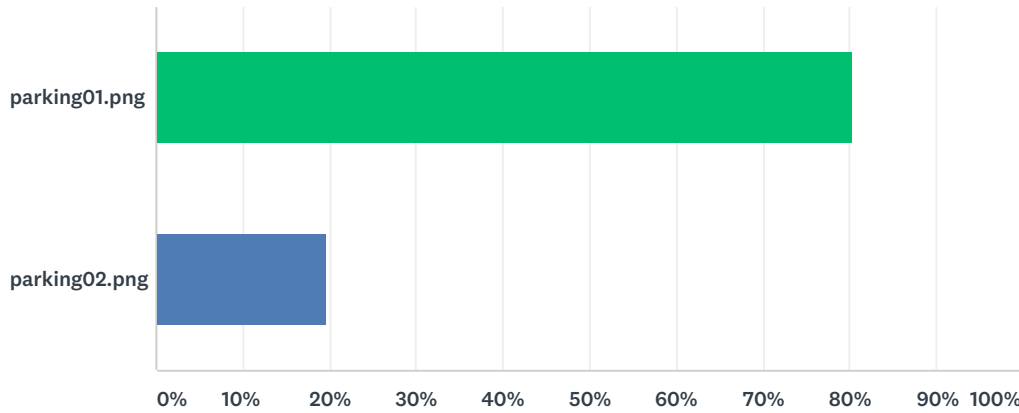

### Q10 Which would you rather see more of in your neighborhood? (Choose One)

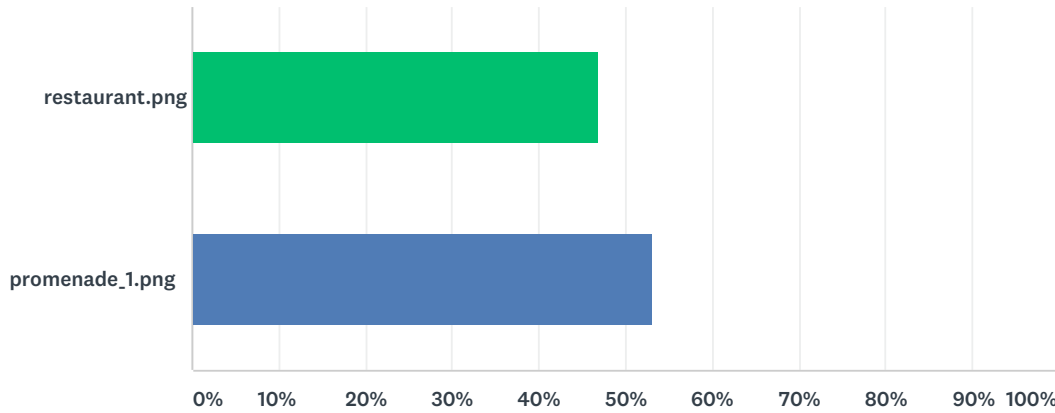

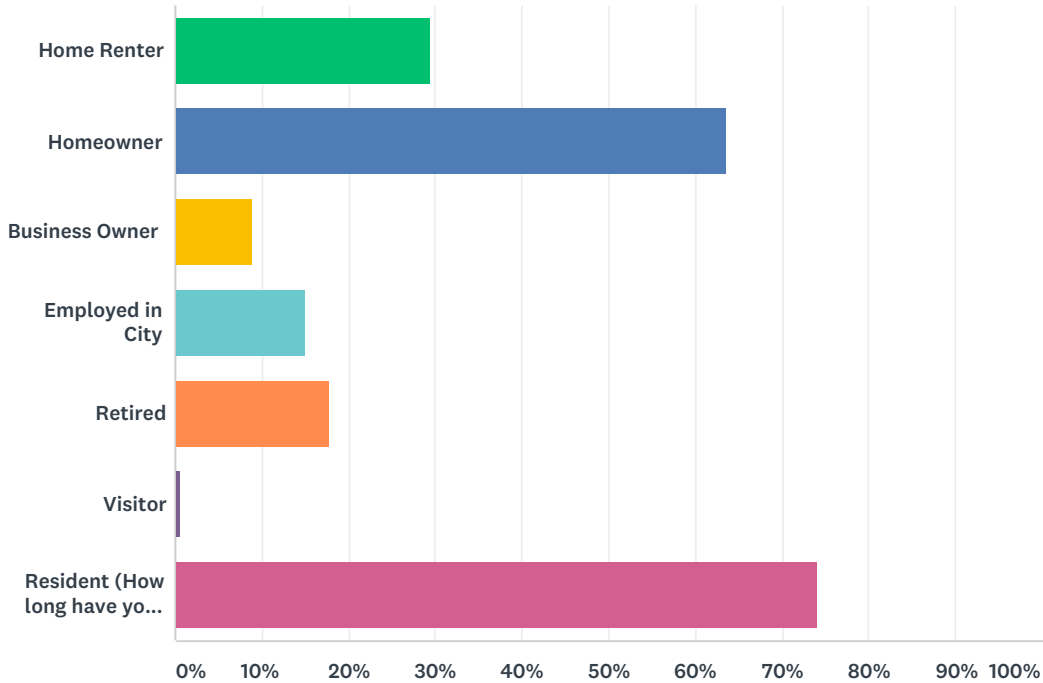

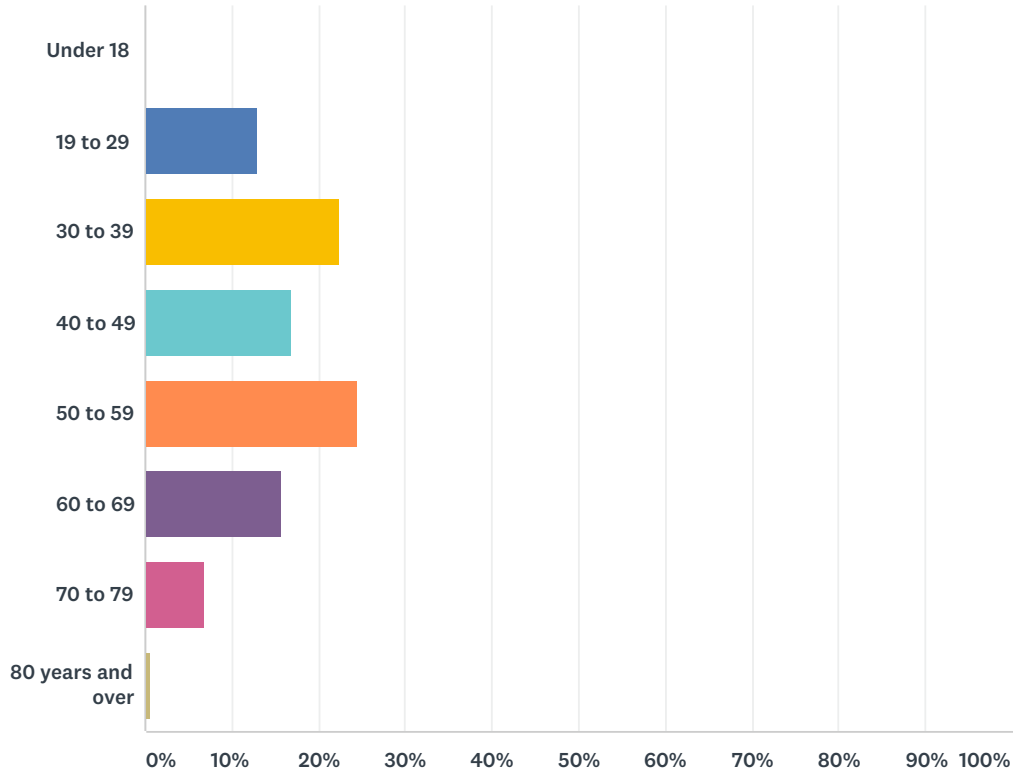
