CLASSIFICATION SPECIFICATION**

TITLE: MARINE SAFETY SERGEANT

DEFINITION: Under direction, supervises and coordinates the activities of an assigned group of Lifeguards and Marine Safety Officers.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES:

- Supervises, trains and evaluates the work of assigned personnel;
- Schedules and assigns personnel and equipment;
- Patrols the beaches to enforce applicable City ordinances;
- Performs rescues;
- Renders first aid including cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR);
- Takes charge of emergency situations until relieved;
- Directs dragging and salvage operations;
- Inspects equipment;
- Issues citations and appears in court when required;
- Conducts training programs and drills;
- Participates in public relation activities of the Marine Bureau;
- Operates a motor vehicle;
- Maintains records and prepares reports;
- Performs other related duties as required.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Open to current City employees who have completed at least two years of active service after permanent appointment as a Marine Safety Officer or Marine Safety Boat Operator; a current certificate in first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation; knowledge of the principles of supervision and applicable enforcement laws and codes; availability to work shifts, weekends and holidays as needed; and a valid motor vehicle operator license.
