**SUBJECT:** Timeline for November 2024 Charter Amendments

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This memorandum outlines the timeline of critical deadlines required to add any Charter amendments to the November 2024 ballot, in the event you are interested in in doing so.

You have also expressed a desire to not hold City Council meetings in the month of July this year. If you are interested in considering any Charter Amendments for the November 2024 ballot and keeping July “dark”, the timeline below must be adhered to, and the City Council must hold a meeting in the last week of June where there usually is no meeting.

This schedule accounts for the time necessary to draft the Charter Amendment, accomplish any meet and confers needed, and hold the two public hearings required by law in time to make the August 6<sup>th</sup> deadline and keep July “dark”.

Arguments and impartial analysis to City Clerk	August 16, 2024
Public examination of arguments and impartial analysis	Aug. 17 – Aug. 26, 2024
Rebuttal to City Clerk	August 26, 2024
Public examination of rebuttals	Aug. 27– Sept. 5, 2024

Please note, the City Council must adopt a resolution to order the election and to add a Charter Amendment to the November 2024 ballot **no later than August 6, 2024**. Please do not hesitate to contact our office if you have any questions.
