Subject: 34th Annual California Coastal Cleanup Day

Long Beach will celebrate California Coastal Cleanup Day on Saturday, September 21, 2019, from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. This statewide event draws over 65,000 volunteers with the common goal of keeping our waterways and coastline clean and healthy (see attached flyer).

El Dorado Nature Center will partner with the California Coastal Commission to coordinate the cleanup at six sites in Long Beach. This year's sites include Alamitos Bay Marina, Sea Scout Base (near Mother's Beach), Colorado Lagoon, The Peninsula, Belmont Pier, and Cherry Beach. Joining in the effort as site captains are the Aquarium of the Pacific, Seal Beach Yacht Club, Long Beach Marine Institute, Friends of the Colorado Lagoon, and Clean LB.

Last year, more than 1,000 volunteers in Long Beach removed nearly two tons of debris in just three hours. This year, we strive to increase the number of participants and continue to provide educational materials to the community. Our goal is to inform the public about marine debris issues and inspire local environmental stewardship.
