- Study and analyze, for the purpose of evaluation and recommendation of policy, issues which have been referred to it by the City Council. This may include, among other topics, rates/fees, lease and land use policies, standards of service, facility requirements and environmental standards.

FESTIVAL OF FLIGHT COMMITTEE EFFORTS

- Identified goals to increase attendance and to raise sponsorship dollars to offset costs for the 2024 Festival of Flight
- Reviewed Airport's "Festival of Flight Sponsor Guide," which included donor recognition levels
- Introduced Airport staff to organizations that may be interested in potential sponsorships;
 provided additional suggestions
- The final results for the 2024 Festival of Flight: more than 12,000 attendees and \$10,000 in sponsor dollars received

SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE EFFORTS







- The Sustainability Committee advises and supports staff on goals and initiatives that help to make LGB a sustainability leader among airports.
- The Sustainability Committee held meetings every other month during 2024 and received regular updates about LGB sustainability efforts and ongoing processes. The committee received presentations regarding the following topics: a progress update on the Sustainability Action Plan and the 2024 Airport Carbon Accreditation process, a presentation from World Energy regarding Sustainable Aviation Fuel (SAF), an update on the Airport's solar array installations on parking lots A and B and an update on the Airport's efforts to procure Zero Emission Vehicles for its operations team.
- During 2024, LGB renewed and completed the third-party verification process for the Airport Carbon Accreditation Level 2 program. The Airport was recognized at the 2024 Airports Council International – North America Annual Conference and Exhibition.
- The Sustainability Committee was also briefed by Airport staff on its ongoing collaboration with the South Coast Air Quality Management District to lower Ground Support Equipment (GSE) carbon emissions.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Your Airport Advisory Commission appreciates the opportunity to serve the citizens of Long Beach. The Airport is an integral part of the City. A key goal of the Airport is to provide business opportunities, air travel services and economic benefits while respecting the quality of life of our communities. The Airport Advisory Commission is a key link in this process. It is important that the Airport maintain its compatibility with the surrounding community. The Commission recognizes the ongoing benefits from its continuing involvement in fulfillment of its mission as prescribed by City Code. The Commission reviews air carrier and total noise budget data to ensure compliance with Long Beach Municipal Code Chapter 16.43 quarterly. This independent oversight provides the public with assurance that Airport staff is adhering to the environmental commitments made to the community. This dedication to providing timely reporting on noise violations and noise complaint data, as well as exploring opportunities to reduce adverse noise events, is important to the public. Their continued commitment to reviewing this information regularly with the Commission ensures compliance with the Noise Compatibility Ordinance and assurance that the Airport is taking its environmental obligations to the community seriously.

As it has in the past, the Commission will continue to interface with the Mayor, Council members and the community to share its views and what it has learned. We encourage your Honorable Mayor and City Council to rely on our resources of knowledge and inter-organizational contacts, including through the referral of issues. Pursuant to Municipal Code Section 2.18.090 (A9), it is recommended that the Airport Advisory Commission continue in its current capacity.
