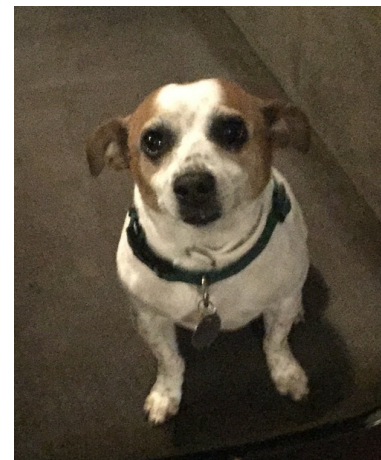

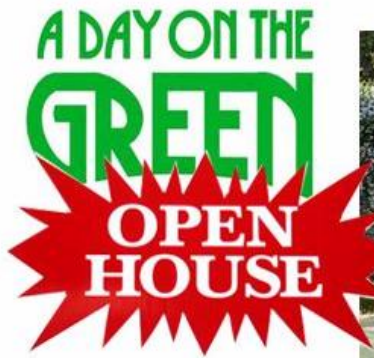

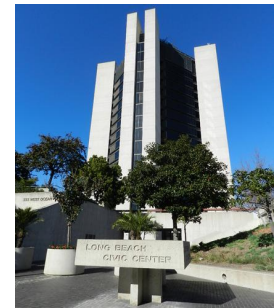
Sunnyside Cemetery Looking for Volunteers

The photo below was taken the year after the Los Altos Shopping Center opened. The Thriftymart grocery store (where CVS is now located) and Sav-on Drugs (where LA Fitness is now located) are visible in the photo. On the front of the bus is an ad for the "Good Ol' Days Downtown" campaign that promoted shopping on Pine Avenue. The irony is that many downtown merchants had opened stores in Los Altos. In fact, Walker's Department Store, F. W. Woolworth and Sav-on Drugs were located at 4th & Pine, and each had a store in the new Los Altos Shopping Center.

El Dorado Nature Center



Looking for a bit of nature in the middle of the city? Nestled between the San Gabriel River and the 605 Freeway, El Dorado Nature Center is an oasis of natural habitat, offering visitors the chance to escape the hustle and bustle of the urban environment.

The 105 acres that make up the Nature Center grounds provide sanctuary for animals and plant life. Two miles of dirt trails and a ¼ mile paved trail wind around two lakes, a stream and forested areas. At the entrance, cross over the wooden bridge that spans the lake and you'll find yourself on a small island that houses the Visitor Center, containing educational displays, art gallery and a small gift shop offering environmentally themed books and gifts.
