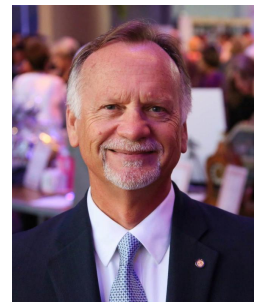

Road Construction at Anaheim and Redondo

On August 13th, construction commenced to widen southbound Redondo Avenue just north of the Anaheim Street intersection. This will add a right turn lane from Redondo to Anaheim to improve traffic flow at the intersection. Project completion is tentatively

scheduled for mid-November. The photo below, taken yesterday, shows how much the street was widened. Don't worry, the utility poles in the middle of the new traffic lane will be removed before paving.

Navy F/A-18's at LGB This Weekend

The U.S. Navy has informed us that four F/A-18 aircraft will be utilizing Long Beach Airport this weekend, and there was already an arrival at 10:04 am this morning. The aircraft will be participating in Los Angeles Fleet Week along with several large helicopters from Law Enforcement, Fire and the U.S. Coast Guard. There will be approximately 25 flyovers with 10 of the flyovers being F/A-18s. The remaining flyover operations will be comprised of helicopters. Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over

August 17th - September 3rd

LBPD is participating in a high-visibility national enforcement campaign, "*Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over*." Police and Sheriff's Departments statewide, along with the CHP, will increase the number of officers on the road to stop suspected drunk or drug impaired drivers and motorcyclists. LBPD will have directed enforcement during this 18-day mobilization to enforce all traffic violations by deploying DUI Saturation Patrols on Saturday, August 25th in the South Division, and Saturday, September 1st citywide. 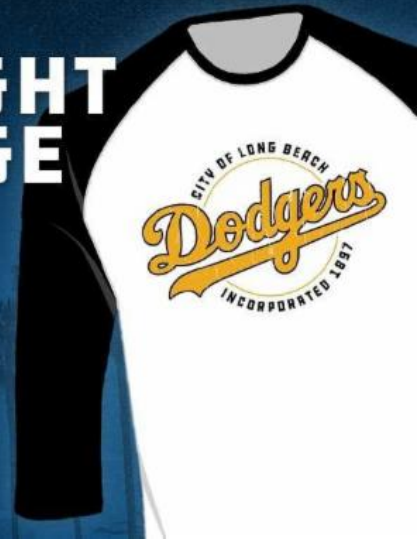

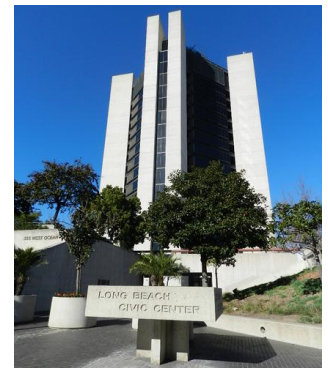

Next on the Council Agenda

Tuesday, September 4th | 5 p.m. | 333 W. Ocean Blvd.

The City Council meeting is scheduled to begin at 5 p.m. in the council chambers on the ground floor of City Hall, located at 333 W. Ocean Blvd. City council meetings are broadcast live online [here](#) and are also available on Channel 3 for Charter cable subscribers and Channel 21 for FIOS subscribers. Here are some of the topics that will be discussed at Tuesday's city council meeting:



- Recommendation to receive and discuss an overview of the Proposed Fiscal Year 2019 budgets for the following Departments: Harbor and Water; and 1. 18-0744 Receive supporting documentation into the record, conclude the public hearing, and take the actions necessary to adopt the Fiscal Year 2019 budget as listed in Attachment A.
- Recommendation to authorize City Manager, or designee, to accept an easement deed from Jack in the Box, Inc., owner of the property at 2101 East Anaheim Street, for alley and sidewalk widening purposes
- Recommendation to direct City Manager to organize and host a Community Budget Meeting with translation services available in multiple languages, starting with Fiscal Year 2020 outreach, as defined by the City of Long Beach Language Access Policy.
- Recommendation to authorize the City Manager, or designee, to execute all documents necessary, including any as-needed agreements, for interim property maintenance and management of City-owned property, commonly known as Community Hospital, at 1720 Termino Avenue, 1760 Termino Avenue, and 4111 East Wilton Street.

Inaugural Ranchos Walk

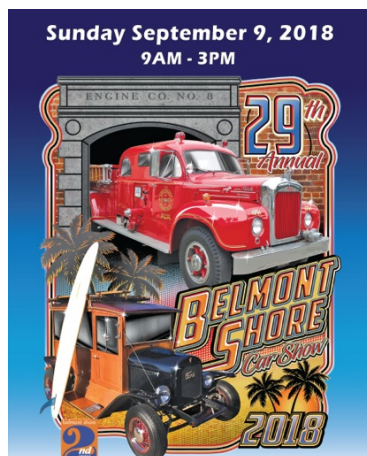
Saturday, September 8th | 7 A.M. | 1200 Palo Verde Avenue

Reservoir Hill Water Tanks

Next Saturday's "Inaugural Ranchos Walk" will cover a part of the 4th council district rarely visited up close and personal. Reservoir Hill is where our City's water supply is located. It was chosen for that purpose because the elevation provides a gravity feed for water distribution. That elevation also provides for great views of Long Beach.
