



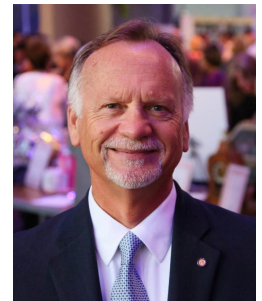

Land Use Element & General Plan Update

Monday night, we held our first "Save the East Side ER" task force meeting at Community Hospital. We had a great turnout of key stakeholders and a very productive meeting. Moving forward, the CHLB Foundation will be funding a study to assess community input, and City Council will have an item on next Tuesday's agenda. 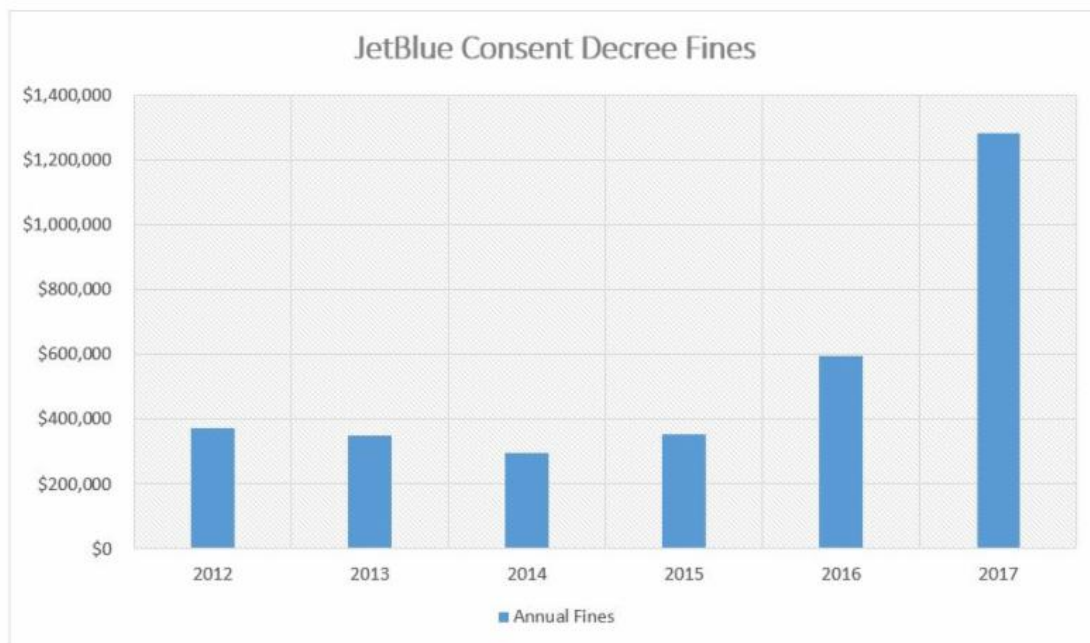

JetBlue Consent Decree Fine Totals

With the first public meeting on proposed revisions to the noise ordinance taking place next Wednesday, it's important to note how we got here. In 2017, JetBlue had a total of 220 Consent Decree violations resulting in a fine total of \$1,284,000. That is more than **double** the fine total of 2016, more than **triple** the total of 2015 and more than **quadruple** the total of 2014, the year before I took office. The evidence is clear that our current noise ordinance is not serving



its intended purpose. Airport staff has begun a process to explore ways of reversing the trend of these escalating noise violations.

LBGO Gas Main Replacement

As part of Long Beach Gas & Oil's (LBGO) ongoing maintenance and replacement program, LBGO has contracted with ARB, Inc. to replace large diameter natural gas distribution mains within the City. Due to the nature of the work, portions of the public right-of-way will be restricted. "No Parking" areas will be limited as much as is practical and will be posted 24 hours in advance when possible. All work along Pacific Coast Highway will be performed during overnight hours Monday night through Friday morning. During that time, parking will be restricted during the hours of 8:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. The "night work" is scheduled to begin on Monday 02/05/18. Work along Outer Traffic Circle and Ximeno Avenue will be performed during work hours of 6:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Thursday. Vehicles parking in the posted areas during work hours will be subject to towing and impound.

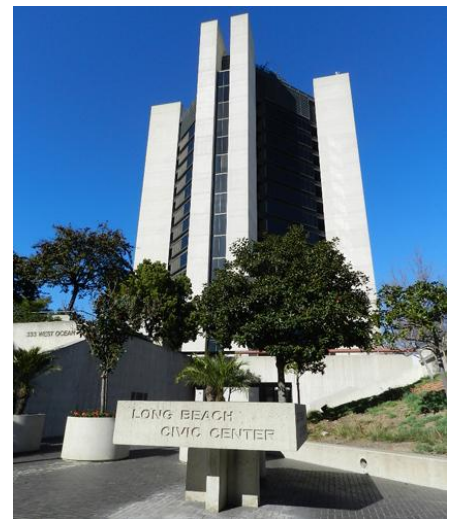

Upcoming City Council Agenda

The city council meeting is scheduled to begin at 5 p.m. in the council chambers on the ground floor of City Hall, located at 333 W. Ocean Blvd. City council meetings are broadcast live online and are also available on Channel 3 for Charter cable subscribers and Channel 21 for FIOS subscribers. Here are some of the topics that will be discussed at Tuesday's special city council meeting:

- The Council will consider a recommendation to request City Manager and staff to prepare an 8 by 28 plan, a needs assessment and project timeline for eight projects that are critical to a successful 2028 Summer Olympics and Paralympic Games; and to prioritize and brand these projects as Olympic priority development projects for future funding opportunities.
- The Council will discuss a recommendation to request City Council to receive and file a report from the Department of Health and Human Services on the status of the current flu levels in Long Beach and Southern California, detailing steps Long Beach residents can take to prevent contracting and spreading the illness.

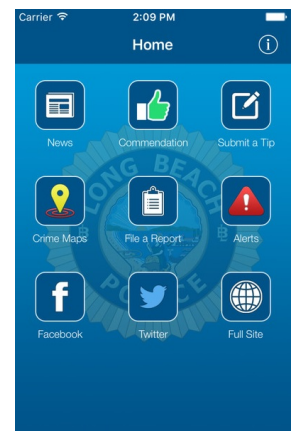

LBDP Online Police Reporting Service

The public has the ability to file police reports online for specific types of crimes that have occurred in the City of Long Beach, through Coplogic, an innovative web-based program. Victims of particular property crimes will have the ability to file a report for free from any computer or mobile device equipped with Internet service; however, the user must have an email address. The types of police reports that can be filed online include:

- Annoying/harassing phone calls
- Thefts and attempt thefts
- Non-injury hit and run traffic collisions (parked vehicles with no witnesses)
- Lost property
- Vandalism/graffiti



Crimes with suspect information, involving firearms, or theft of medication, passports, and license plate registration tags are not eligible for online reporting. To file a report, access Coplogic by visiting the Long Beach Police Department's [website](#).

And Finally

Lakewood Blvd. and State Street?

As it turns out, Chick-fil-A isn't the first chicken restaurant to be located at the southeast edge of the Traffic Circle. Seventy years ago, St. Clair's Circle featured "New Orleans Fried Chicken" at the the exact same spot. St. Claire's identified the Circle location as Lakewood Blvd. & State St. That's because PCH was named State Street west of the Traffic Circle. Southeast of the Circle, PCH was named Hathaway Avenue. The names were changed to Pacific Coast Highway in the late 1940's. The circular St. Clair's Circle drive-in restaurant can clearly be seen in the vintage photo below.
