Go Long Beach Awards

Congratulations to CD4 residents, Judy Seal, Susana Sngiem and

Janey Roeder for receiving Go Long Beach Awards last week from Mayor Garcia. Each year, the awards are presented to Long Beach residents who are doing great things in the community.

Judy Seal has served as the Executive Director of the Long Beach Education Partnership since 1994, she started the Education Celebration and has organized Long Beach's Principal For A Day event since 2000.



Susana Sngiem is the first second-generation Cambodian-American woman to serve as United Cambodian Community's Executive Director and currently serves as a board member of the Long Beach Community Action Partnership and the City of Long Beach Homeless Services Advisory Committee.

Jane Roeder served as Executive Director of Leadership Long Beach, demonstrating visionary leadership that moved the organization to national prominence and acclaim, and now serves as Interim Director of the Ukleja Center for Ethical Leadership at California State University, Long Beach.

Update on Oversized Vehicle Parking Restrictions

Long Beach residents expressed concerns relating to oversized and recreational vehicle impacts, especially in residential neighborhoods and commercial corridors. To address concerns, the City Council passed an item requesting staff to develop provisions for citywide parking restrictions of oversized vehicles and RVs in June 2017. An ordinance was later approved in August



2017. Staff is in the process of finalizing the citywide oversized vehicle parking restriction signage in approximately 80 locations citywide. Once installed, residents will have a 30-day grace period where warnings, not parking citations, are issued. You can read the entire update at this <u>link</u>.

LA County Board of Supervisors Supports CHLB

Last Tuesday, Supervisor Janice Hahn introduced a motion in support of Community Hospital during the LA County Board of Supervisors meeting. The motion included:



- 1. Direct the hospital to hold a public hearing on April 11th so residents can make their voices heard
- Direct LA County to formally endorse a California State Law (AB 2591 (O'Donnell)
 which would give the hospital a five year extension to complete retrofitting
 requirements.

Thanks to Supervisor Hahn for advocating for Community Hospital. I also want to thank Councilman Al Austin, Long Beach City staff and residents for speaking at the meeting in support of the motion.

Stanford MS Student is County Spelling Champ

Dina Miranda, a seventh grader at Stanford Middle School, was the countywide champion at the Los Angeles County Scripps Regional Spelling Bee this month. The competition, which involved 150 spellers culled from nearly 35,000 students at more than 300 public, private, magnet and religious schools in the county, lasted 10 hours and 26 rounds, with 507 words given. Miranda is the first student from the Long Beach Unified School District to win the countywide competition and will represent LBUSD at the Scripps National Spelling Bee in Washington, D.C. this May. Weekly Updates

Easter at El Dorado Regional Park/Nature Center

Parks and Rec sent a notice to all patrons visiting El Dorado Regional Park or the Nature Center on Easter Sunday.

Please be aware of the following:

- Park hours are 7:00am 8:00pm. All patrons must be out of the park by closing.
- Holiday parking rate is \$8. Cash Only. No Refunds of parking fee.
- There is no parking on the grass. Vehicles will be cited, or towed.
- Unloading and Loading areas will be available along the roads. Please do not block traffic flow.
- Extra parking and picnic space is located in Area 3, north of Wardlow Street. Please follow the signs to the overflow lot. Parking may not be near your picnic location.
- There are no drops-offs or unloading on Spring Street, or Wardlow Street. Vehicles will be cited.
- Early arrival is encouraged, once capacity is reached, additional vehicle entries will not be allowed.
- Vehicles exiting the park, may not be granted re-entry if park closes for capacity.
- El Dorado Nature Center will be closed.



Next on the Council Agenda: April 3rd

Prior to the City Council meeting, there will be a study session pertaining Community Hospital at 3:30 PM. We will be receiving an update from City Staff about the current status and next steps.

The city council meeting is scheduled to begin at 5 p.m. in the council chambers on the ground floor of City Hall, located at 333 W. Ocean Blvd. City council meetings are broadcast live online and are also available on Channel 3 for Charter cable subscribers and Channel 21 for FIOS subscribers. Here are some of the topics that will be discussed at Tuesday's special city council meeting:



- Council will discuss a recommendation to adopt a resolution authorizing City Manager to execute a contract, including any necessary amendments, with AMS.NET for the purchase and installation of fiber optic cabling and related electrical equipment for the Library Services Department, in the amount of \$110,680, authorize a 20 percent contingency in the amount of \$22,136, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$132,816
- Council will consider a recommendation to request City Attorney to draft a resolution in support of the Safe Consumer Lending Act (AB 2500).

Long Beach Grand Prix Inaugural 5k Run


On Sunday, April 8th, participants will have the unique opportunity to "run the course" on the Grand Prix race circuit - the first time the course has been open to a running

The 5K course will start at the official Grand Prix start/finish line on Shoreline Drive, then head up Pine Avenue and Seaside Way, returning to Shoreline Drive on a two-lap tour of the circuit. The "early bird" entry fee is \$35. On April 7 and race day, April 8, the fee will be \$40. The entry fee entitles each paid runner a



finisher medal, an inaugural Grand Prix 5K t-shirt and a complimentary Friday general admission ticket to the Toyota Grand Prix of Long Beach, a \$33 value. More information can be found here.


Long Beach Playhouse AIDS Food Store Fundraiser

Circle Area Restaurant With a Hollywood Connection

Just east of Ximeno on Pacific Coast Highway, where Pep Boys now stands, was once home to a restaurant with an interesting Hollywood connection. Radio, film and television actor, Claude Stroud, opened the Golden Drumstick in 1952. The dining room seated hundreds, and they also had drive-thru service. Marketing slogans included "World's best food - World's lowest prices" and "Children welcome as the flowers in May". Thursday's 95-cent luncheon included a fashion show featuring "Barbara Blakey and Her Cover Girls". Barbara Blakey owned a modeling school and was a local celebrity having been named "Queen of Belmont Shore" in 1948. She later married Frank Sinatra and gained notoriety for her philanthropic work as Barbara Sinatra. The Golden Drumstick was eventually sold to Don May who turned it into "The Hawaiian", but that's a story for another Go Fourth! Friday newsletter.
