



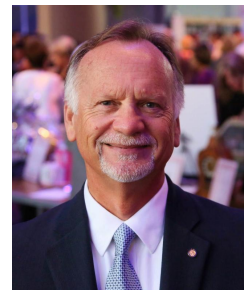

COVID-19 Updates

Coronavirus (COVID-19) Update

By the Numbers (Long Beach only | As of 7/16/20):

- 6,252 total positive results
- 157 fatalities
- 98 people hospitalized
- Approximately 4,585 recovered (Please note that, for low-risk patients recovering at home, recovery data is self-reported)
- Data dashboard updated July 15

Details Regarding Fatalities:

- 118 are associated with long-term care facilities
- Ages:
 - 2 were in their 40s
 - 9 were in their 50s
 - 34 were in their 60s
 - 35 were in their 70s



- 52 were in their 80s
- 25 were over 90
- 72 female, 85 male
- All individuals had underlying health conditions
- At this time, to avoid risk to patient privacy, no further details will be provided

Long-Term Care Facility Case Information:

- 1,069 positive cases have been confirmed at a total of 31 long-term care facilities (LTCF) in the city since the start of the pandemic (see attachment).
 - Thirty-one is a cumulative number; the Health Department is currently monitoring long-term care facilities with active cases. These cases include both facility residents and staff members (who may not be residents).
 - Long Beach has a total of 71 LTCFs, including assisted living and skilled nursing, that are currently open and operating in the city.
 - In line with the California Department of Public Health's standard for [listing skilled nursing facilities](#) with positive cases, the City is listing facilities currently experiencing outbreaks (more than two cases of COVID-19) including counts for health care workers and residents.

Testing for Long Beach Residents:

- We strongly encourage all Long Beach residents who are interested in being tested to first contact their Primary Care Provider or Healthcare Center about receiving a test at their facility. If you do not have access to this care or are unable to contact them, free testing is available at CVS and at City of Long Beach testing locations. Outdoor Dining Spots in District 4

With the re-closing of indoor dining announced by Governor Newsom on July 1st, many CD4 restaurants have geared up their already existing outdoor dining areas. Others have established new outdoor dining areas by utilizing the City's "Parklet Program". We'll be highlighting these restaurants in the coming weeks. Grocery Stores in the Fourth District

All stores are getting regular shipments of food, and they are restocking shelves each day. However, some stores are restricting entry to prohibit overcrowding which may lead to longer wait times outside the store. Rental Assistance for Tenants Impacted by COVID-19

City Council approved an [Emergency Rental Assistance Program](#) specifically for qualifying tenants impacted by COVID-19. The Long Beach CARES program will provide up to \$1,000 per month of rental assistance payments for up to three months on behalf of qualifying Long Beach residents who have lost income due to COVID-19 and meet federal low-income requirements. The monthly assistance payments will be provided directly to landlords or property owners on behalf of qualifying residents and be applicable to rent due during the eligible period from March 27, 2020, until the end of the City's Safer at Home Order. Past Events

Rent Moratorium Extended Through September

On Tuesday night, City Council voted unanimously to extend the

rent and eviction moratorium through September 2020. Tenants will still need to provide proof that they've been impacted by COVID-19 to utilize the rent deferral option. With the revised moratorium, rents due between April and September can be deferred, but the entire balance is due July 31st, 2021. On average, that amount would be a total of \$9,000 for tenants who have deferred payment for each of the six months. Council also approved my friendly amendment requesting correspondence to be sent to Congress and State representatives asking for mortgage relief for property owners who have lost revenue from renters who have been unable to pay partial or complete rent payments.

Street Sweeper Citation Waiver Extended

On Wednesday, the street sweeper citation waiver program, scheduled to expire today, was extended indefinitely. The issue will return to Council for direction on how to proceed at a later date. For now, residents who have received a street sweeping citation, and are experiencing COVID-19 related financial hardships, can request to have their fines waived by following the instructions on the back of the citation.



Fourth District Business Grants

City Council approved the allocation of Fourth District One-time Priority Funds for a District Restart Grant Program to assist CD4 businesses damaged by the events of May 31st. LBPDP Looting Task Force Nets Multiple Arrests

The Long Beach Police Department (LBPDP) created a Looting Task Force in response to civil unrest that took place in the City of Long Beach on May 31, 2020. The taskforce has utilized video and photo evidence collected from various sources, including business and residential surveillance systems, social media, news coverage, and submissions to the LBPDP's [online evidence portal](#), to identify suspects involved in looting and other criminal activity. Formed on June 1, 2020, the task force operates Monday through Friday and has already arrested 14 suspects for various charges. Read the entire press release at this [link](#).

F/A-18 Operations at LGB Tomorrow

Saturday, July 18th | Long Beach Airport

The U.S. Marine Corps has informed LGB that two F/A-18 aircraft will be conducting training operations at the airport on Saturday, July 18. They anticipate these aircraft will arrive late in the morning on Saturday and depart in the afternoon on Saturday, but all times are



tentative and subject to change. LBB will be informing the community via WebTrak, social media and their website. Included in the messages to the community will be a reminder that these aircraft are exempt from noise regulations; however, the military has demonstrated a desire to assist us in being a good neighbor and they have been very responsive to community concerns within their mission and safety of flight constraints. The aircraft will use noise abatement procedures when operating in the vicinity of Long Beach. These procedures include modified arrival and departure flight profiles and minimum use of afterburners.

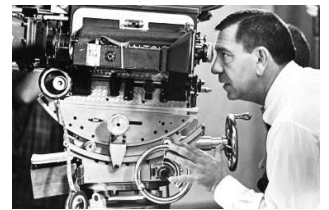
City Council & Public Safety Committee Meetings

Take the Budget Survey for Fiscal Year 2020-2021

The City of Long Beach has an average annual budget of approximately \$3 billion. Priorities for our council office include the continued restoration of Fire Engine 17 and a fire academy in February 2021. About 80% of the annual budget is tied to designated funds that limit how the funding can be used. The remaining 20% of the budget pays for most of the City's public resources such as streets and sidewalks, police patrol, fire response, parks and recreation, and library services. Early budget projections anticipated a shortfall, and this has been exacerbated by the COVID-19 response and lost revenue sources. In total, the FY 21 budget must resolve a \$30 million deficit. The [budget prioritization survey](#) is another opportunity to share feedback with the City Council about what items should be prioritized.
