

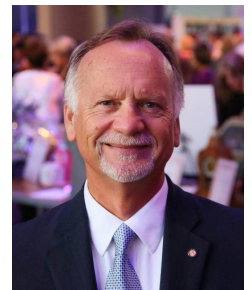

COVID-19 Updates

Coronavirus (COVID-19) Update

By the Numbers (Long Beach only):

- 12,870 total positive results
 - 65 new cases since yesterday
 - Seven-day positivity rate: 3.1%
 - 6.4 daily new cases per 100K population
- 255 fatalities
- 51 people hospitalized
- Approximately 12,143 recovered (Please note that, for low-risk patients recovering at home, recovery data is self-reported)
- 254,275 total tests conducted
- Information as of October 21

State Indicators (Updated on Tuesdays):

- Current LA County Tier: Purple Tier (Widespread)
- Seven-day positivity rate: 3.4%
- 7.6 daily new cases per 100K population



- Testing positivity in lowest-resourced areas (health equity metric): 5.9%

Details Regarding Fatalities:

- 156 are associated with long-term care facilities (LTCF)
- 106 female, 149 male
- 254 individuals had underlying health conditions

Testing

- We strongly encourage all Long Beach residents who are interested in being tested to first contact their Primary Care Provider or Healthcare Center about receiving a test at their facility. If you do not have access to this care or are unable to contact them, free testing is available at CVS, Rite Aid and at City of Long Beach testing locations. Tomorrow, Saturday, the 11-day vote centers will open at 10:00 am. There are six locations citywide, and two are close to the 4th council district: the Carpenter Center at 6200 E. Atherton and the Masonic Center at 5155 E. PCH. When visiting a Vote Center this weekend, take your Sample Ballot Booklet to expedite the check-in process. An Election Worker will scan the barcode on it. The VBM Drop Boxes are also available with ballots now being collected daily through November 3rd. Street Sweeper Citation Waiver Extended

Yesterday, City staff recommended extending street sweeping citation forgiveness through November 30th to continue to assist residents in need during the pandemic. The time period for these dismissals was previously set to expire on October

31st. Through October 12th, the City had received approximately 7,500 requests to dismiss street sweeping citations. Residents who have received a street sweeping citation, and are experiencing COVID-19 related financial hardships, can request to have their fines waived by following the instructions on the back of the citation.

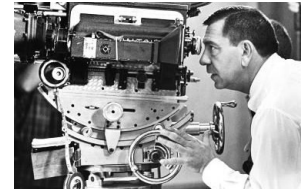

Filming in the Fourth

Filming will take place at 1720 Termino Ave. On October 27th, filming will consist of interior and exterior dialogue with gunfire. Production to have weapons brandished and in view of public. Production to have gunfire on the exterior of the hospital in the driveway on the south side of the building. Production to have squibs on actors, picture car windows, planters, etc. on the south side of building. On October 28th, filming will consist of actor parking across the street, and running across to the courtyard of the/hospital. 13th Annual Bike and Pedestrian Count

City of Long Beach is seeking volunteers for 13th Annual Bike and Pedestrian Count. Accurate count data acquired by this annual event helps the City determine the safety and effectiveness of infrastructure projects and provides staff with key information for designing new projects. The more volunteers who join the effort, the more locations the City can analyze. This year, the bike and pedestrian count will be sent to volunteers electronically or by mail. City Guidelines on Halloween Restrictions

The City is providing guidance for celebrating Halloween safely that includes safer alternatives that still promote a festive environment amid the COVID-19 pandemic. Halloween activities that are allowed, in adherence with the City's [Safer at Home](#) Order and related protocols, include:



- Online parties/contests (e.g., costume or pumpkin carving).
- Car parades, such as drive-by events or contests.
- Halloween movie nights at drive-in theaters.
- Halloween-themed meals at outdoor restaurants.
- Halloween-themed art installations at outdoor museums.
- Dressing up homes and yards with Halloween themed decorations.

Halloween activities that are not allowed include:

- Halloween gatherings, events or parties with non-household members, even if conducted outdoors.
- Carnivals, festivals, live entertainment and haunted house attractions.

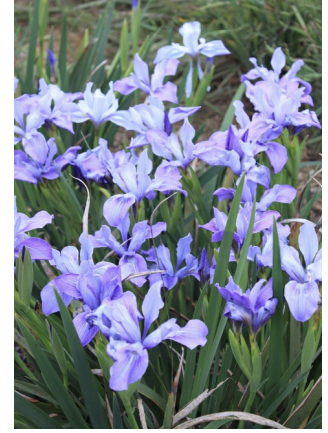


- Thursdays, 3 p.m. to 6 p.m., LBCC Veterans Stadium (5000 E. Lew Davis St.)

The Long Beach Department of Parks, Recreation and Marine is reimaging their annual California Native Plant Sale at El Dorado Nature Center to follow COVID-19 safety guidelines. Hundreds of beautiful and beneficial native plants will be offered in this year's drive-through sale. Drive through the designated order fulfillment line 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, November 3 - 21. Staff will collect the completed order form and load the plants into the shopper's vehicle. Pre-orders are not available; and the items chosen on one's plant order form is distributed on a first-come, first-served basis. 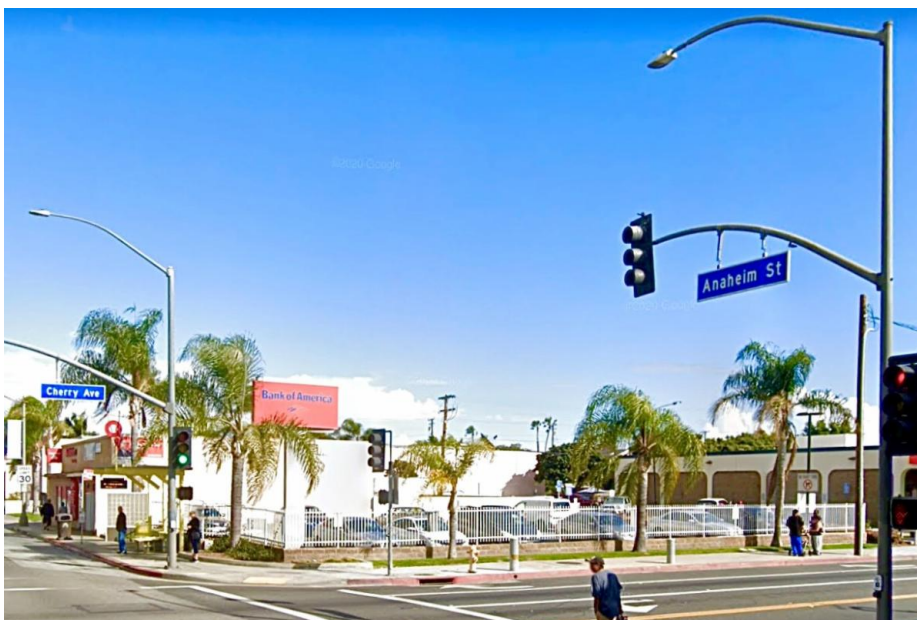

And Finally

BofA and F&M Bank Histories in CD4

In a previous "And Finally" feature, we told you about the two branches of Farmers & Merchants Bank (Los Altos & East Long Beach) in the 4th council district. We included a vintage photo of the ELB Branch building at the S/W corner of Anaheim and Obispo. That building was razed, and the new building was set off the corner to accommodate a parking lot. The exact same history applies to Bank of America. There are two branches in CD4 (Los Altos & Anaheim/Cherry), but the original building at 2000 E. Anaheim St. no longer exists. As shown in the vintage photo below, it was located right on the S/E corner of Anaheim and Cherry. The new BofA building was set off the corner to accommodate a new parking lot.
