



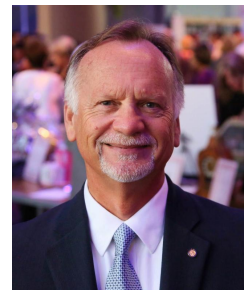

COVID-19 Updates

Coronavirus (COVID-19) Update

By the Numbers (Long Beach only | as of 9/24/2020):

- 11,727 total positive results
 - 43 new cases since yesterday
 - Seven-day positivity rate: 3.9%
 - 7.4 daily new cases per 100K population
- 243 fatalities
- 45 people hospitalized
- Approximately 10,904 recovered (Please note that, for low-risk patients recovering at home, recovery data is self-reported)
- 213,226 total tests conducted
- Information as of September 23

Details Regarding Fatalities:

- 153 are associated with long-term care facilities (LTCF)
- Ages:
 - 2 were in their 20s



- 5 were in their 40s
- 22 were in their 50s
- 56 were in their 60s
- 57 were in their 70s
- 67 were in their 80s
- 34 were over 90
- 103 female, 140 male
- 242 individuals had underlying health conditions

"After School Reimagined" Fall Camp Programs for Youth

Parks, Recreation and Marine (PRM) is launching a series of after school camp programs for youth through the fall season with lower staff-to-camper ratios and other enhanced safety protocols. The "After School Reimagined" programs will be offered Mondays through Fridays from 3 pm to 6 pm beginning Tuesday, September 8th. Youth can participate in fitness activities, games, crafts, homework help and more. The cost of the program is \$10 per week, per participant, and scholarships are available. After school programs will be offered at three CD4 locations: Orizaba Park (1435 Orizaba Ave.), Stearns Champions Park (4520 E. 23rd St.) and Whaley Park (5620 E. Atherton St.). CM to Work With Caltrans on Freeway Trash Issues

Last week, council directed City Manager, Tom Modica, to engage with Caltrans on the agency's failure to address freeway trash issues. The council agenda item also included the City's Public

Works and Development Services Departments and Los Angeles County. Our council office is often asked about freeway on ramp/off ramp issues including trash and weeds, and we contact Caltrans on behalf of the resident. There are also reporting options where anyone can file a complaint by phone or online. F/A-18 Operations at LGB Today & Tomorrow

Fri - Sat | September 25th - 26th | Long Beach Airport

The U.S. Marine Corps has informed LGB that two F/A-18 aircraft will be conducting training operations at Long Beach Airport this weekend. It is anticipated these aircraft will arrive late this afternoon, September 25th, and depart early in the afternoon on Saturday, September 26th. All times are tentative and subject to change. LGB will be informing the community via WebTrak, social media and their website. The aircraft will use noise abatement procedures when operating near Long Beach. These procedures include modified arrival and departure flight profiles and minimum use of afterburners.

City to Offer Free Flu Vaccination Clinics

Oct. 1st - Nov. 21st | Vets' Stadium & Cabrillo High School



The Long Beach Health Department is offering access to flu vaccinations in the coming season by hosting several community flu vaccination clinics at no charge for individuals without health insurance or those whose healthcare provider does not offer flu vaccines. The clinics will operate on the following days and times beginning October 1, 2020 through November 21, 2020, or while supplies last:

- Thursdays, 3 p.m. to 6 p.m., LBCC Veterans' Stadium (5000 E. Lew Davis St.)
- Saturdays, 10 a.m. to 1 p.m., Cabrillo High School (2001 Santa Fe Ave.)

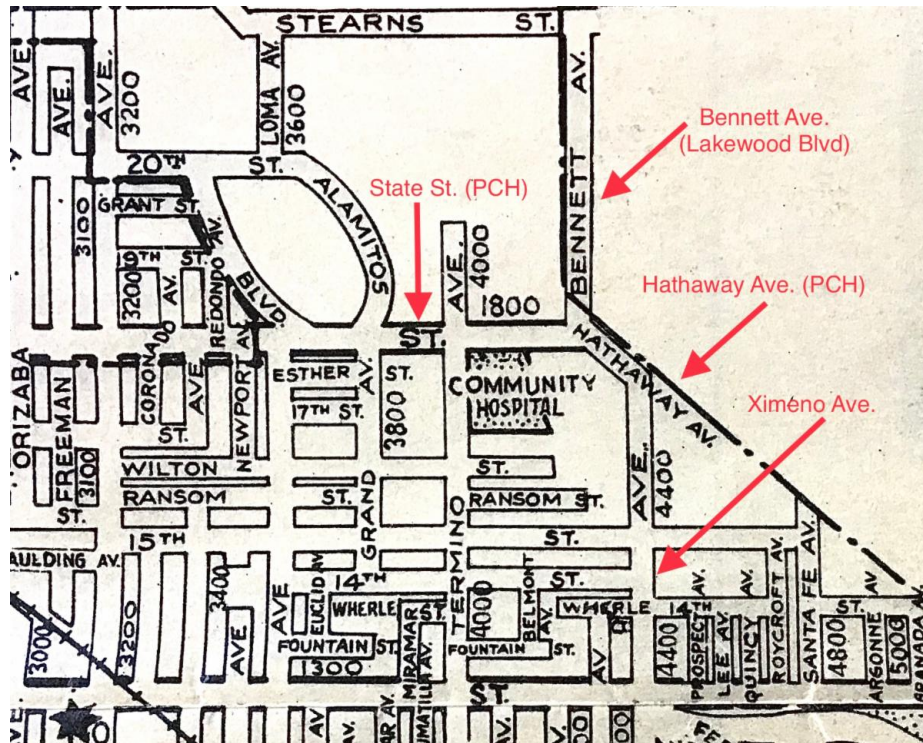
And Finally

Lakewood Blvd. aka SR-19 aka Bennett Avenue

Along the 10th and Anaheim Street corridors in the 4th council district, the order of streets from east to west is Ximeno, Bennett and Roswell. However, north of the traffic circle, in the Artcraft Manor neighborhood, one of the streets is missing. Ximeno Ave. is

east of Lakewood Blvd., and a Roswell Ave. is west of Lakewood Blvd., but Bennett Ave. is nowhere to be found. So what happened to Bennett? The mystery was solved by an early 1930's F&M Bank street map. Before the traffic circle was built, Ximeno ended at Hathaway (now PCH), and Bennett continued north of Hathaway. It later became Lakewood Blvd. and California State Route 19. Caltrans relinquished the Long Beach portion of SR-19 to the city on January 17, 1999.

The F&M Road Map map below (circa 1930) shows the convergence of three streets at what would later be the traffic circle: State St. from the west, Bennett Ave. from the north and Hathaway Ave. from the southeast. The Ximeno Ave. name has not changed, but it did not extend beyond Hathaway (PCH) in the 1930's. The star at the lower left of the map indicates the location of F&M Bank's East Long Beach Branch at Anaheim and Obispo.
