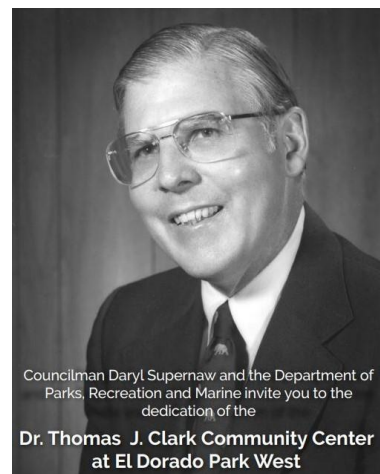

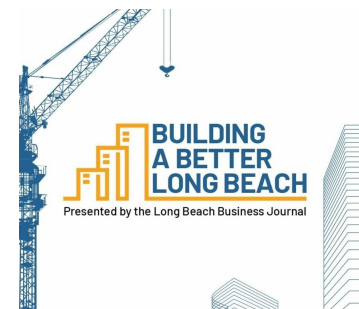

## CSULB Learning Institute Summer Classes

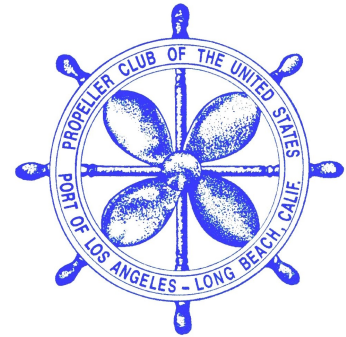

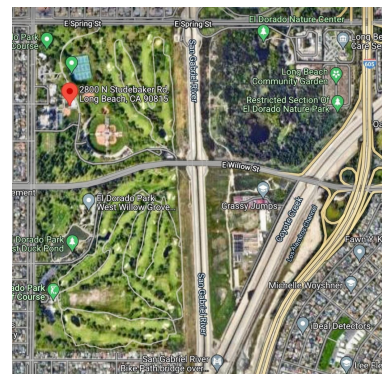

## And Finally....

### El Dorado Park in 1968

With the Dr. Thomas J. Clark Community Center dedication taking place tomorrow morning, we're featuring an aerial photo of the park taken on August 22, 1968. Tom Clark had only been a councilman for two years, but you can see the park amenities were established. That's because Dr. Clark had previously served as a Parks & Rec commissioner, and that's where the vision for the park was established. As you can see in the 1968 photo, the basic layout was in place minus (and it's a huge minus) mature trees. At the upper left and upper right, the El Dorado Library and Animal Care Services facilities were yet to be built. At the bottom center, you can get an idea of the altitude of the plane taking the photo as a jetliner (circled in red) crosses over the San Gabriel River. We certainly owe a debt of gratitude to civic leaders like Tom Clark for their dedication to create open space for future generations.
