## COVID-19 Updates

### Long Beach Issues Updated Health Order

This week, the LB Health Department issued an updated Health Order to align with the California Department of Public Health (CDPH). It no longer requires, but strongly recommends, the following high-risk settings to maintain a process for verifying patrons are fully vaccinated including:

- Bars, breweries, craft distilleries, and wineries
- Nightclubs and lounges
- Indoor Mega Events

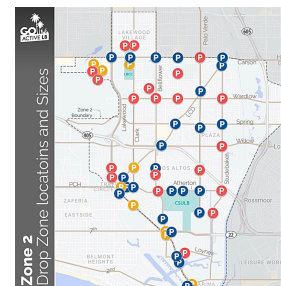
## Applications Open for Recovery Act Grants

The City is now accepting applications for the recently announced Long Beach Recovery Act Small Business and Nonprofit Relief grants, a new recovery program to help small businesses and nonprofits that have experienced financial hardship due to the COVID-19 pandemic. ## New Rules for E-Scooter Parking in ELB

As of March 17th, ALL e-scooters in East Long Beach must be parked in a virtual e-scooter parking corral. You can find corral locations in each of the 4 e-scooter apps. Residents and businesses are encouraged to report any e-scooter parking violations through the City's Go Long Beach App. Once reported, e-scooter vendors will typically remove the vehicle within 2 hours. ## FREE Tax Preparation from CSULB

The CSULB College of Business is offering FREE income tax preparation online now through April 9, 2022. The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) IRS program provides virtual appointments to individuals who qualify as low-income (\$58,000 annually), students, the elderly, non-residents and limited English proficiency. March 25 - 26 | 10 am - 3 pm | 2141 Bellflower Blvd.

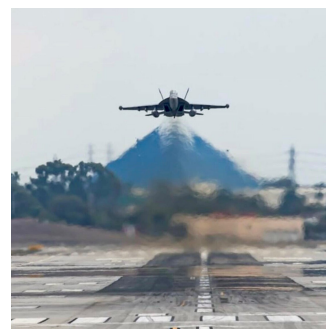

## F/A-18 Operations at LGB This Afternoon

The U.S. Marine Corps has informed LGB that four (4) F/A-18 aircraft will be conducting training operations at Long Beach Airport Friday, March 25th. It is anticipated these aircraft will arrive this afternoon (Friday) and depart shortly after, but all times are tentative and subject to change. LGB has informed the community via WebTrak and social media that these aircraft are exempt from our noise regulations. However, they will use noise abatement procedures including minimum use of afterburners when operating in the vicinity of Long Beach.

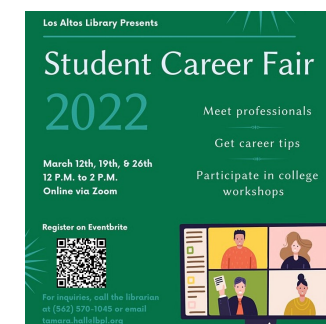
