The Office of the City Clerk has partnered with the Los Angeles Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk to bring the [Vote By Mail Drop-Off Program](#) to Long Beach. Vote by Mail ballots may be returned by mail (no postage required), in person at any Vote Center or at any Vote by Mail drop box. Long Beach voters have 24-hour access to drop boxes at participating locations across LA County. Next on the City Council Agenda

May 24th | 5:00 pm | 411 W. Ocean Blvd.

The City Council meeting will start at 5 pm in the Bob Foster Civic Chambers on the ground floor of City Hall, located at 411 W. Ocean Blvd. City council meetings are broadcast live online and are also available on Channel 3 for Charter cable subscribers and Channel 21 for FIOS subscribers. Here are some topics that appear on next Tuesday's agenda:



- R22: Recommendation to request City Manager to prepare an update on the temporary parklet program and return to council prior to the June 30 sunset date for the program.
- R28: Recommendation to adopt Specifications No. RFP ED22-023 and award a contract to Fund for Guaranteed Income, of El Segundo, CA, to implement and administer the Long Beach Guaranteed Income Pilot Program, in a total amount not to exceed \$460,915 for a period of two years, with the option to renew for three additional one-year periods, at the discretion of the City Manager; and, authorize City Manager, or designee, to execute all documents necessary to enter into the contract, including any necessary subsequent amendments. (Citywide)
- R32: Recommendation to adopt resolution approving a list of projects citywide for repaving and resurfacing that are proposed to receive Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account funding in a total estimated amount of \$10,661,747 in the Fiscal Year 2023 Paving Program. (Citywide)

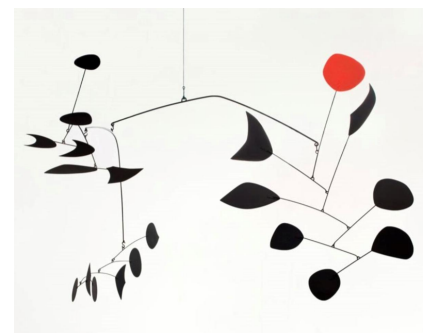

May 26th | 10:00 am - 11:15 am | 2900 Studebaker Rd.

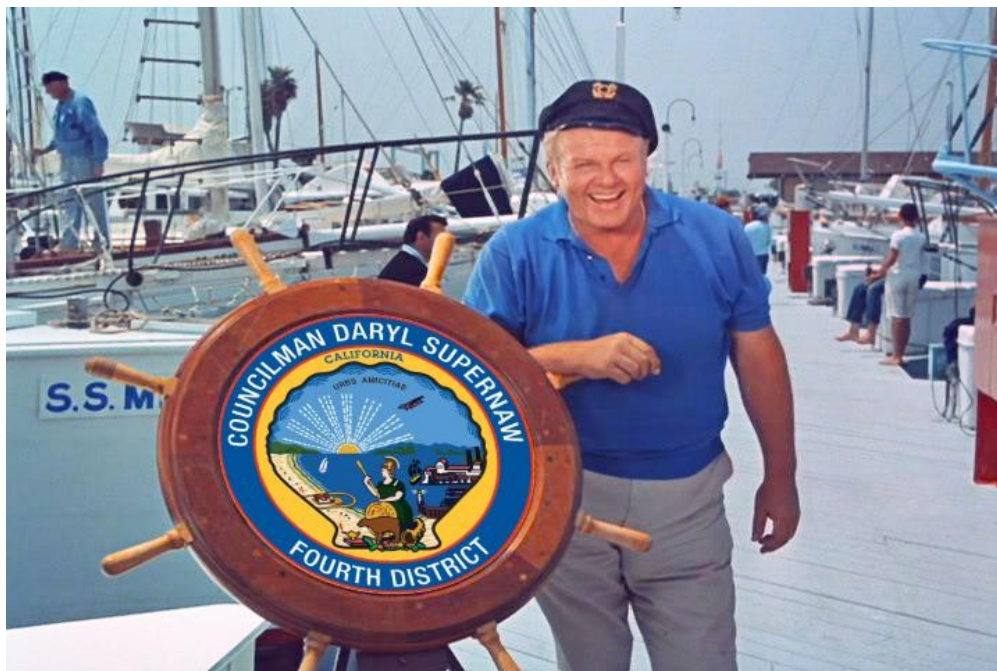

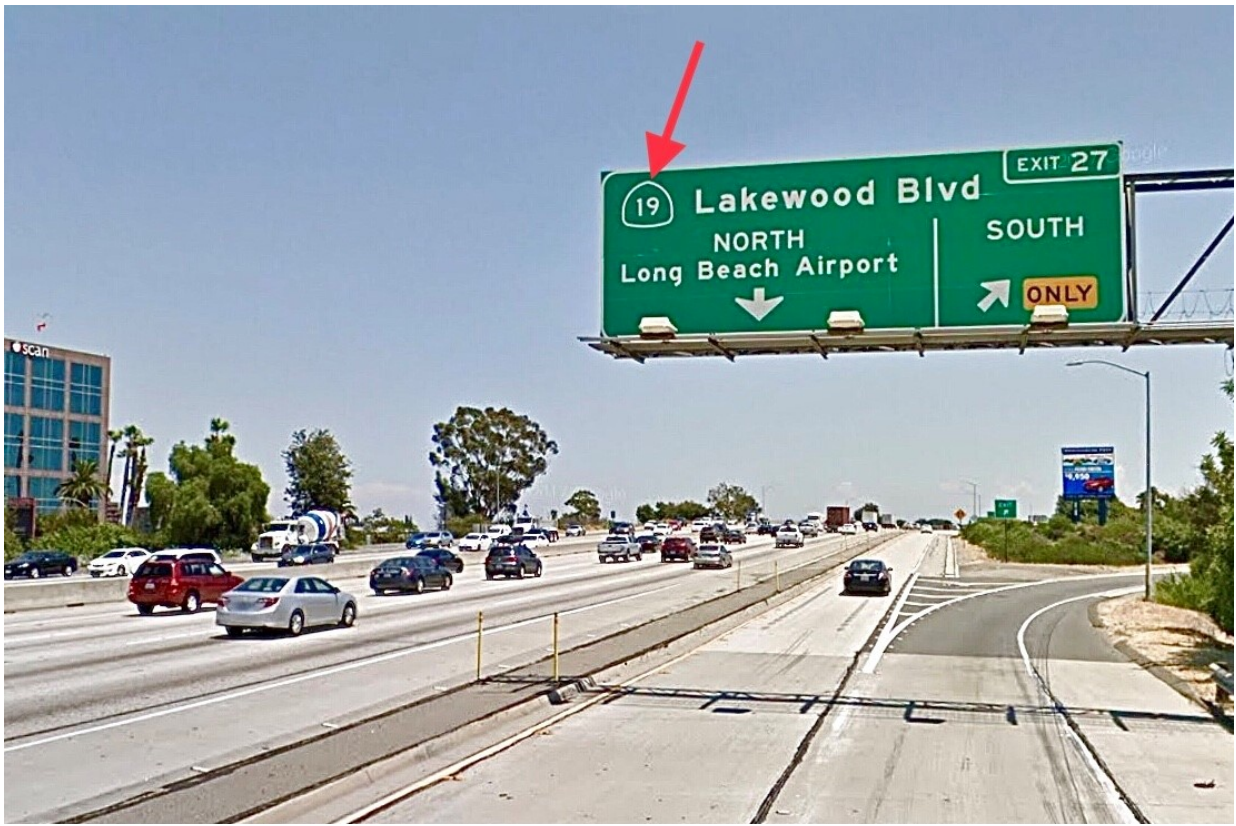
And Finally....

Lakewood Blvd. (aka) CA State Route 19

Last week, we mentioned Lakewood Blvd. lost its designation as CA State Route 19 many years ago, but there is still "19" signage located in Council District 4. We asked for emails from anyone who knew the locations. Congratulations to Emilio Paerels who correctly identified the Caltrans sign at 4511 E. PCH near the Carl's Jr. driveway. Unlike the 405 Freeway signs that include "Lakewood Blvd" with "19", the sign near the traffic circle only indicates "19". The other location is on northbound Lakewood Blvd. as you exit the airport tunnel. It is a stand-alone sign that simply indicates that you are driving on CA State Route 19.



CA 19 within the City of Long Beach was relinquished as a State Highway pursuant to terms of a cooperative agreement between the City and the California Transportation Commission. The relinquishment of CA 19 in Long Beach was authorized by Assembly Bill 2132, Chapter 877 on September 26th, 1998. The City of Long Beach does not appear to be held to a stipulation to maintain the signage. That being said, I'm all for nostalgia, and I'd like to see the signs remain.
