Greater LB Alumnae Panhellenic 100th Anniversary



Greater Long Beach Alumnae Panhellenic recently marked the 100th anniversary of its founding and was presented with a Proclamation from the City of Long Beach by Councilman Daryl Supernaw on behalf of Mayor Rex Richardson. The proclamation honored the nonprofit for “programming that emphasizes sisterhood, leadership, lifelong learning, professional development, and philanthropic activities aimed at special-needs children, at-risk women, medical research and care, and other charitable causes.” The Long Beach delegates represent 26 sororities of the National Panhellenic Conference, which is one of the largest advocacy and support organizations for women in the country. The local chapter is focused on promoting academic excellence and community service. Through the years, it has awarded more than \$115,000 in scholarships to active sorority women attending CSULB as well as to those who graduated from high school in the greater Long Beach area but attend a college or university elsewhere in the United States. 2023 Homeless Count Results Released

Yesterday, the city released the results of the 2023 Homeless Point in Time Count. Findings of the count identified 3,447 people experiencing homelessness in January 2023, compared with 3,296 people in 2022. This number signifies a 4.6% increase from last year, the smallest increase Long Beach has reported since 2019. For reference, homelessness increased 7% from 2019 to 2020 and increased 62% from 2020 to 2022 (the 2021 Count was canceled due to the pandemic). LBFD Releases Incident Report

Last week, the Long Beach Fire Department released a "Green

Sheet" regarding the explosion that occurred on November 8, 2022, at the Captain David Rosa Regional Training Center. The Green Sheet is an internal investigation summary and training aid that fire departments distribute to their personnel following a significant incident. Based on the assessment of the incident, corrective action has been instituted or is in the process of implementation to prevent future occurrences. Primary areas of focus consist of changes to live fire training protocols, personnel qualifications, and enhanced communication processes. The occurrence of this incident continues to emphasize the risky environment that defines the fire service, even during training activities. However, the Long Beach Fire Department will continue to abide by the philosophy of "Train as if your life depends on it... because it does!"



Main Runway Closures Two Days a Week

In addition to the nightly closures, LGB's Main Runway 12-30 has begun daytime closures on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. The duration of the closure will be April 18th through May 24th. Major electrical upgrades to improve safety of the primary runway are being installed necessitating the temporary runway closures. During Runway 12-30 closures, operations will move to Runway 8L-26R. Those flight paths are shown in gold on the attached map while the Runway 12-30 flight paths are shown in blue. 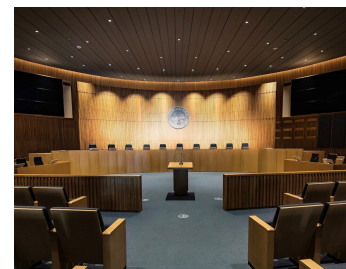

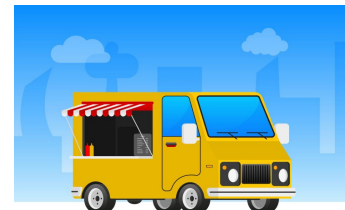
- C-24: Recommendation to receive and file the application of Moston Restaurant Group 2.0 LLC, dba District 4 Pizza, for an original application of an Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) License at 2123 North Bellflower Boulevard, submit a Public Notice of Protest to ABC; and, direct City Manager to withdraw the protest if a Conditional Use Permit Exemption (CUPEX) is granted. (District 4)
- R-31: Recommendation to adopt resolution approving the proceedings by the Finance Authority of Long Beach for the issuance and sale of its Lease Revenue Bonds, Series 2023 to finance the acquisition and refurbishment of an existing building for municipal uses and to finance certain capital improvements of the City of Long Beach (City), in an aggregate not to exceed principal amount of \$90,000,000, and authorize the execution of related documents, and approving related official actions. (Citywide)
- R-34: Recommendation to receive and file an update on the Fiscal Year 2023 - Fiscal Year 2027 Infrastructure Investment Plan; and Increase appropriations in the Capital Projects Fund Group in the Public Works Department by \$52,750,000 to fund the various projects identified in the Fiscal Year 2023 Infrastructure Investment Plan, offset anticipated bond proceeds from the Measure A Bond program.
