F/A-18 Operations at LGB this Weekend

The U.S. Navy has informed LGB that three (3) F/A-18 aircraft will be conducting operations at Long Beach Airport from Friday, October 6th through Sunday, October 8th. It is anticipated that the aircraft will arrive in the afternoon on Friday around 5 pm, will conduct a fly-over the USC football game on Saturday and depart around 3 pm on Sunday. Included in the messages is a reminder that these aircraft are exempt from Long Beach noise regulations.

- Friday (10/13) between 7:00 am – 10:00 am

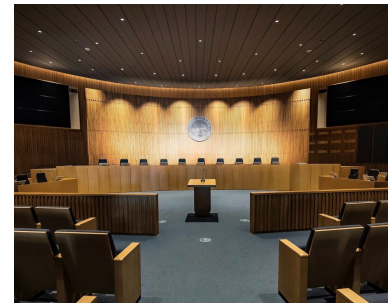

The City Council meeting will start at 5:00 pm in the Civic Chambers on the ground floor of City Hall, located at 411 W. Ocean Blvd. City council meetings are broadcast live online at: LBTV3.com and on Channel 3 for Charter cable subscribers and Channel 21 for FIOS subscribers. Comments can be submitted by email to: CityClerk@longbeach.gov. Items on Tuesday's meeting agenda include:



- C-1: Recommendation to increase appropriations in the General Fund Group in the City Manager Department by \$500, offset by the Fourth Council District One-time District Priority Funds transferred from the Citywide Activities Department to provide a contribution to Hispanas Organized for Political Equality (HOPE) in support of their annual Long Beach Latina Empowerment Day;
- C-3: Recommendation to increase appropriations in the General Fund Group in the City Manager Department by \$1,000, offset by the Fourth Council District One-time District Priority Funds transferred from the Citywide Activities Department to provide a contribution to the Millikan High School Baseball Boosters, Inc. in support of their "Anything is Possible" capital improvement campaign;

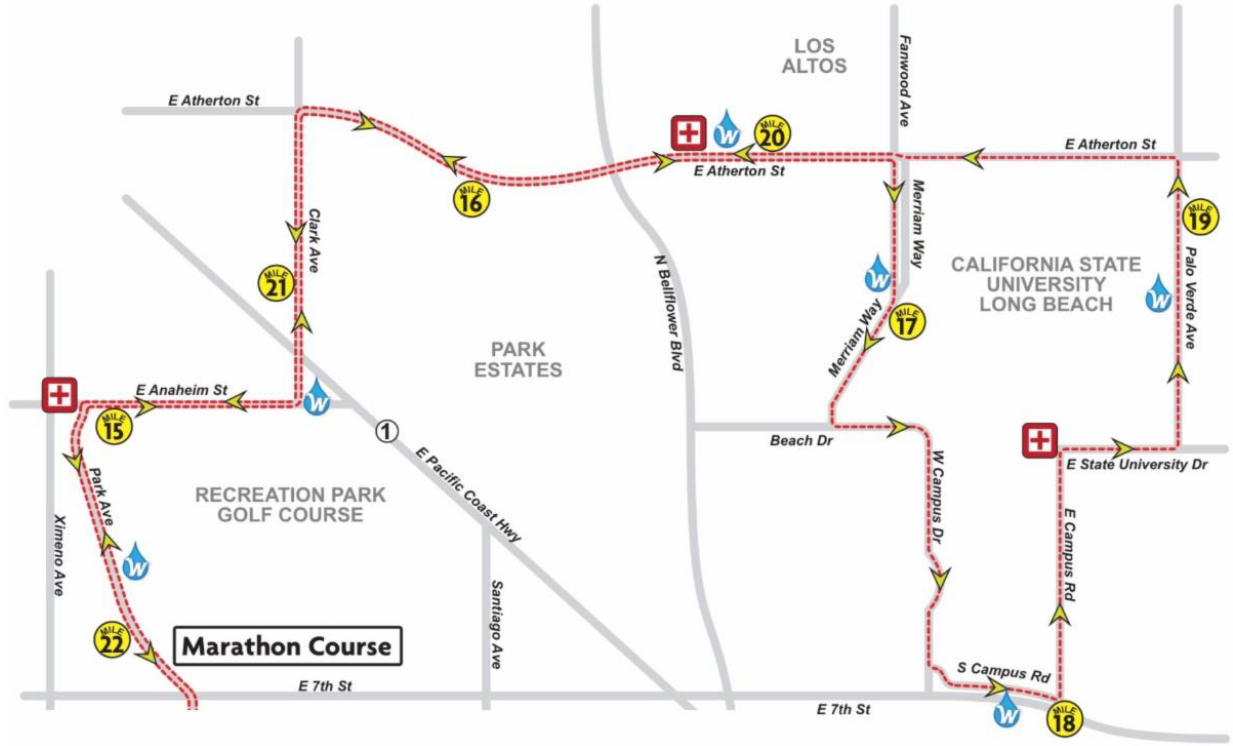


Long Beach Marathon Next Weekend

LGB F/A-18's to Perform Flyover at Coliseum

It's not unusual for a team of F/A-18 fighter jets to stage at the Long Beach Airport in preparation for a flyover event. After all, they do it every April for the Acura Grand Prix of Long Beach. It's always an impressive event at the AGPLB, but the cars sometimes seem louder than the F/A-18's. It's a different feeling when a flyover takes place over a football stadium. In this case, we're told it will happen tomorrow at the 91-year-old Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum, and the event is Saturday evening's USC v. Arizona football game. I don't recall military jets staging at LGB for an LA Coliseum flyover, but our astute readers will let me know if I'm mistaken.



There is an incredible amount of preparation that goes into performing a flyover at any sporting event. The timing has to be synchronized perfectly so the jets appear overhead at the exact moment the final note of the national anthem is played (or sung). It actually involves military ground personnel at the site providing information to the pilots via radio. A few years ago, NFL Films produced a 5:43 minute mini documentary on how it all happens.
