72nd Annual LBLL Opening Day Ceremony

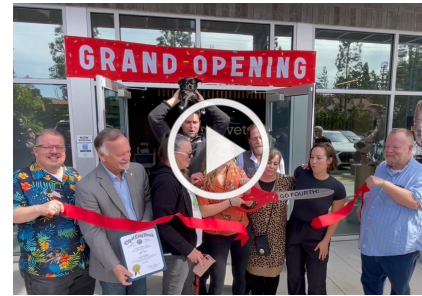

New Health Department Director Alison King

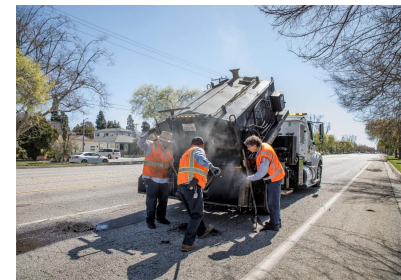

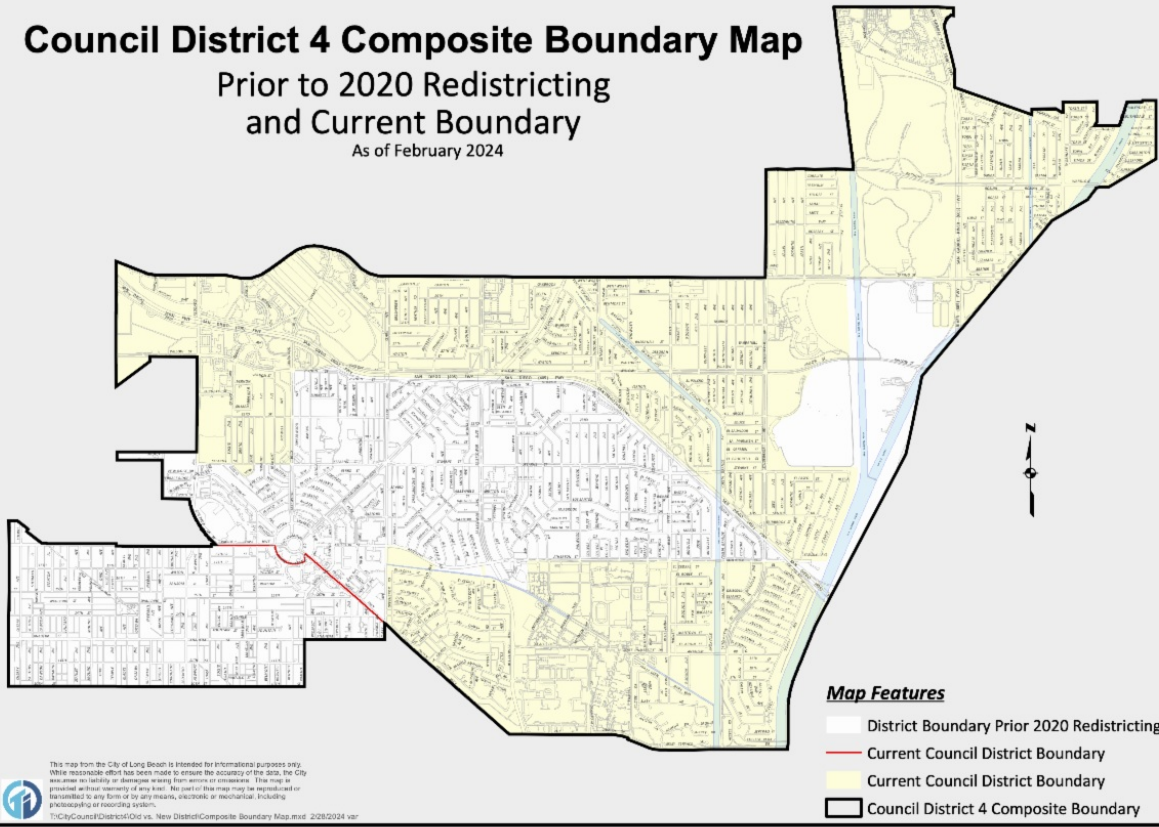
Old CD4 and New CD4 Comparison

Ever since redistricting took place in December 2021, we have been asked to explain the old versus new Council District 4 borders. It's not easy to explain verbally, so we are using the attached map to illustrate the difference by overlaying the former on the current district. You can click on the image to zoom in. The old CD4 is shown in white, while the new CD4 shown in a yellow background. The new border near the traffic circle is shown with a red line. If you're wondering why we expanded so much when the section we lost is so small, that is due to population density. Each council district is required to have a population of around 51,000 people. The smaller section of the original CD4, southwest PCH, is within the most densely populated zip code in the city. When the border was moved, we lost 30,800 residents, or 60% of our population. We had to expand tremendously to the north and south to pick up those population numbers. It was a managerial challenge to say the least, but I believe our team handled it seamlessly. BTW, to put the 51,000 population number in perspective, that's larger than half the cities in Los Angeles County.
