## PCH Bike Lane Project Community Survey

Caltrans is proposing a bike lane on Pacific Coast Highway (PCH) within the City of Long Beach to provide safer infrastructure for non-motorists. Beginning at the Long Beach Traffic Circle and ending at the LA River Bike Path, this project will contribute to the growing bicycle network in the region and ensure that users of all abilities can travel safely on the State Highway System. Community input is an essential part of this process, and feedback received will be incorporated into the development of the project. Caltrans has opened a survey for community input. 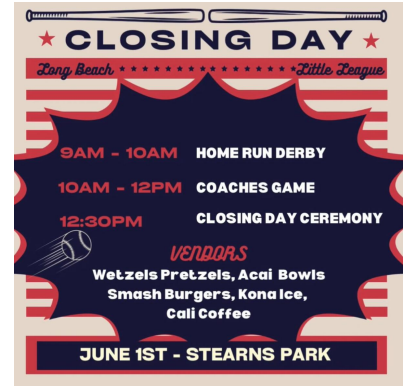

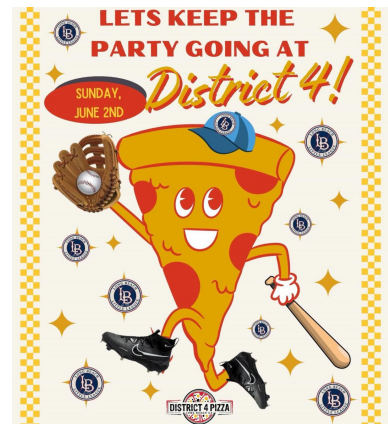

## Next on the City Council Agenda

June 4th | 5:00 pm | 411 W. Ocean Blvd.

The City Council meeting will start at 5:00 pm in the Civic Chambers on the ground floor of City Hall, located at 411 W. Ocean Blvd. City council meetings are broadcast live online at: [LBTV3.com](https://www.lbtv3.com) and on Channel 3 for Charter cable subscribers and Channel 21 for FIOS subscribers. Comments can be submitted by email to: [CityClerk@longbeach.gov](mailto:CityClerk@longbeach.gov). Items on Tuesday's meeting agenda include:



- **C-4:** Recommendation to increase appropriations in the General Fund Group in the City Manager Department by \$1,000, offset by the \$500 of the Fourth Council District One-time District Priority Funds and \$500 of the Third Council District One-time District Priority Funds transferred from the Citywide Activities Department to provide a contribution to the Tichenor Clinic for Children for the 9th Annual Superheroes Carnival & Resource Fair; and decrease appropriations in the General Fund Group in the Citywide Activities Department by \$1,000 to offset a transfer to the City Manager Department.
- **C-6:** Recommendation to increase appropriations in the General Fund Group in the City Manager Department by \$800, offset by Fourth Council District One-time District Priority Funds transferred from the Citywide Activities Department to provide support for the following: \$500 to Camerata Singers of Long Beach in support of their young artist pilot program; \$300 to the Long Beach Century Club Inc in support of their annual Hall of Fame sports banquet; and decrease appropriations in the General Fund Group in the Citywide Activities Department by \$800 to offset a transfer to the City Manager Department.
- **C-23:** Recommendation to adopt resolution authorizing City Manager, or designee, to execute an Agreement, and any necessary documents including any subsequent amendments, with the County of Los Angeles, CA, for the Woodruff Avenue Traffic Signal Synchronization Project (TSSP) to modify and synchronize the traffic signals along Woodruff Avenue from Rosecrans Avenue to Willow Street in a total amount not to exceed \$795,700, for a period of two years with the option to renew for 3 additional one-year periods, at the discretion of the City Manager. (Districts 4, 5)
- **R-27:** Recommendation to request City Manager, through the Governmental Affairs team and in coordination with the City Prosecutor, Police Department, and Health and Human Services Department, provide an overview of proposed legislation that serves to address retail theft, drug use, and "smash and grab" crimes in California, within 30 days. This overview, provided as a Council letter and presented to the Public Safety Committee, should include a description of the Homelessness, Drug Addiction, and Theft Reduction Act, Californians Together Against Retail Theft package, Working Together for a Safer California Plan package, #SmartSolutions Policy Platform, and other related proposals as appropriate; and request City Manager, through the Governmental Affairs team and in coordination with the City Prosecutor, Police Department, and Health and Human Services Department, provide policy position recommendations, through a Council letter and presented to the Public Safety Committee, on proposed legislation that furthers priorities included in the City Council-approved 2024 Legislative Agenda.

### Stearns St. Centennial Pepper Tree Ceremony

On Tuesday morning, we had a large media turnout for the special dedication of the century-old California pepper tree located in the Artcraft Manor Neighborhood. The event, hosted by the Community Development Department, included a ceremonial plaque unveiling for the iconic tree along the Stearns Street parkway on the south side of Stearns Champions Park. Thanks to Larry Rich, Office Of Climate Action & Sustainability, and Allison Spindler Ruiz, Community Development, for speaking at the event. Click on the video window for a snippet of the ceremony.
