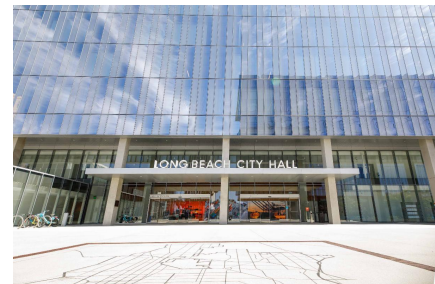

Past and Ongoing Events

City of Long Beach FY25 Adopted Budget

On Tuesday, September 10th, City Council voted to adopt the City of Long Beach's \$3.6 billion budget for Fiscal Year 2025 (FY 25). The Adopted FY 25 Budget maintains current services while making significant one-time investments in key priority areas. These included one-time funding of \$200,000 to support the Long Beach Violence Prevention Initiative. Structural funding includes keeping Engine 17 in service in CD4 on a permanent basis. 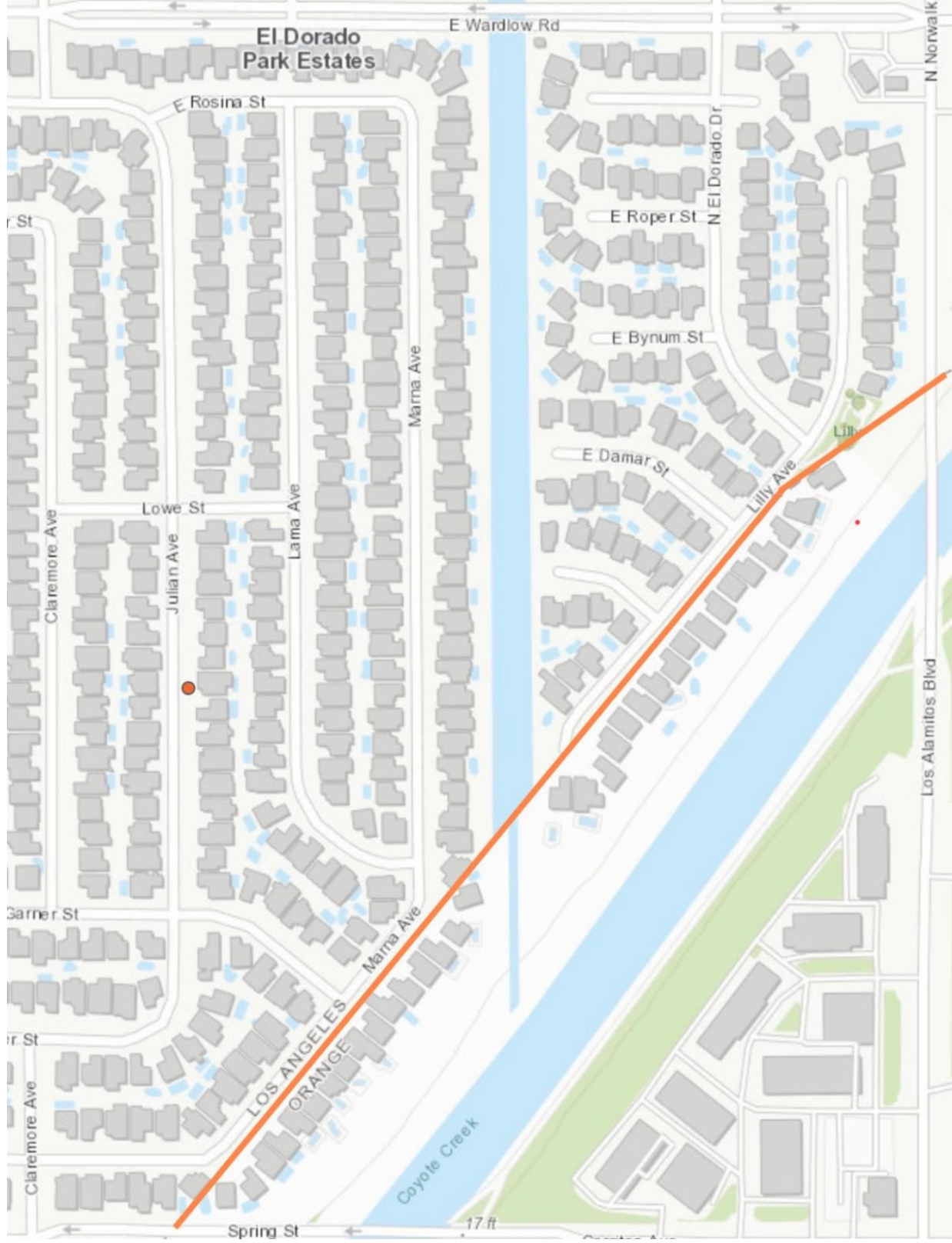


And Finally...

EDPE Neighborhood in 1968

The final section of the El Dorado Park Estates Neighborhood to be built was the southeast quadrant. It is shown to the far right in the attached black & white aerial photo taken in 1968. The attached newspaper ad for EDPE homes features the "NEW '68 MODELS" priced from \$36,850. However, the most unique aspect of the southeast quadrant is that your new home could be located in either Los Angeles or Orange County. As shown in the attached color map, the county line runs down the middle of both Lilly and Marna. When I attended the Lilly Park event last Saturday, I parked in Orange County and walked to the park in LA County.
