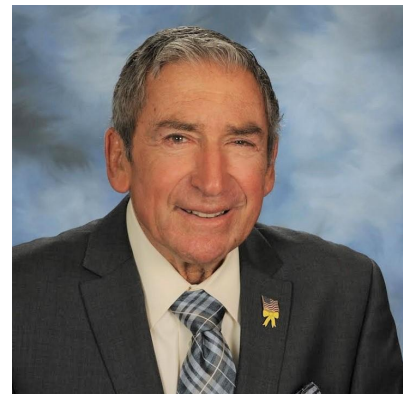

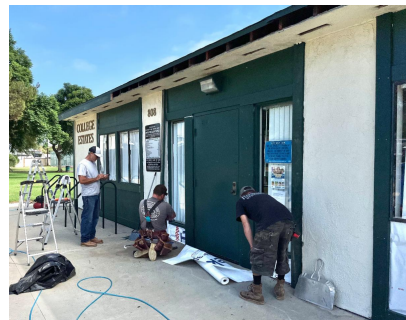
## CD4 Community Meeting with Doug Haubert

## Sewer Pipe Restoration in CD4

Construction through end of year | 7:30 am - 3:30 pm

The Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts (LACSD) have contracted with Spiniello Infrastructure West, Inc. to [rehabilitate the sewer with a pipelining system](#), which is installed inside the old pipe. The existing sewer pipe is over 50 years old and has deteriorated over time due to normal wear and age. The crew has been actively installing the replacement pipe liners at Spring/Claremore in El Dorado Park Estates and are expected to move towards Norwalk, south of Wardlow by mid-October. All work should be complete by the end of the year. Please expect traffic delays in the area. Alternate routes are recommended. 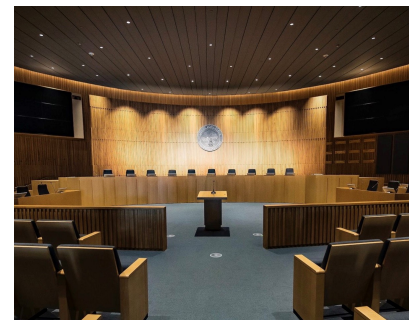

The City Council meeting will start at 5:00 pm in the Civic Chambers on the ground floor of City Hall, located at 411 W. ## California Keeping Pace With Long Beach

Last Monday, September 23rd, Governor Gavin Newsom signed bipartisan legislation to impose stricter penalties and strengthen law enforcement's ability to combat sidschows and street racing takeover events. You can read the Governor's press release at this [link](#). If that legislation sounds familiar, Long Beach enacted a similar ordinance that I proposed three years ago! It was on Friday, July 9, 2021 that a street racing takeover event took place at Bellflower Blvd and Stearns St. We immediately started getting calls from neighbors, and I was able to collect videos over the weekend. On Monday, July 12th, I submitted a council agenda to be heard the following Tuesday. Going from criminal incident to council agenda item in eleven days was a very compressed schedule, and it required us to complete our research for the council presentation in a very short time. However, I felt the need was so urgent that it required me to act quickly. My council colleagues agreed, and the vote was unanimous to create a new city ordinance. We also owe a debt of gratitude to (then Lieutenant) Shaleana Benson for all her work in crafting the ordinance on LBPD's side. She now serves as the Commander of the East Patrol Division.
