If your refuse, recycling or organics bin is not collected by the end of your scheduled service day, you can make a report by calling (562) 570-2876 or submitting a report online [here](#). The online form has check boxes for each of the three categories:

- **Trash** was not collected
- **Recyclables** were not collected
- **Organics** were not collected



## Organics Green Bin Replacement Process

Long Beach Recycles allows one green cart size exchange every 6 months. After completing a request [online](#), a customer service representative will contact you within 3-5 business days to verify your account. If you have not heard within 5 business days, please call (562) 570-2876 to confirm your request has been received. Please note: There is shortage of all organics carts. Cart exchanges are scheduled to resume the week of November 3rd. Customers who request a smaller bin will have their bill adjusted to reflect the smaller bin rate effective the date their request for a smaller bin is submitted. Billing for increased bin sizes will be effective the date the bin is delivered to your home.



## Studebaker Groundbreaking Ceremony

On Tuesday, a ceremonial groundbreaking was held near the duck pond for the Studebaker Road Transformation Project. Studebaker will be the longest (5.1 miles) and most expensive (\$53 million) corridor transformation project in the City's history. ## SoCalGas Project at the Towne Center

Begins September 29th | M-F 7:30 am - 3:30 pm | 7250 Carson Blvd.

SoCalGas has notified our office of a pipeline replacement/hydrostatic testing project scheduled to begin on Monday, September 29th at 7250 Carson Blvd, south of the Walmart parking lot. This project plans to hydrostatically test approximately 5.73 miles of mostly 30-inch pipe on Line 1020, install new piping/valves, and remove portions of existing pipeline. On-site construction noise is expected. Work hours will be Monday through Friday, between 7:30 am and 3:30 pm. Work is expected to be completed by November 21st, 2025. 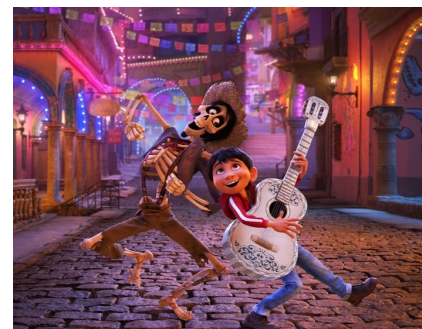
