The Neighborhood Leadership Program (NLP) is offered by the Long Beach Community Development Housing and Neighborhood Services Bureau. This five-month, multilingual program assists grassroots residents and provides them with the skills, knowledge and resources they need to make a difference in the quality of life of our community.

This program is free to participants and is partially funded through the Federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program.
