Although a public agency, the Port's operations are not supported by tax dollars.

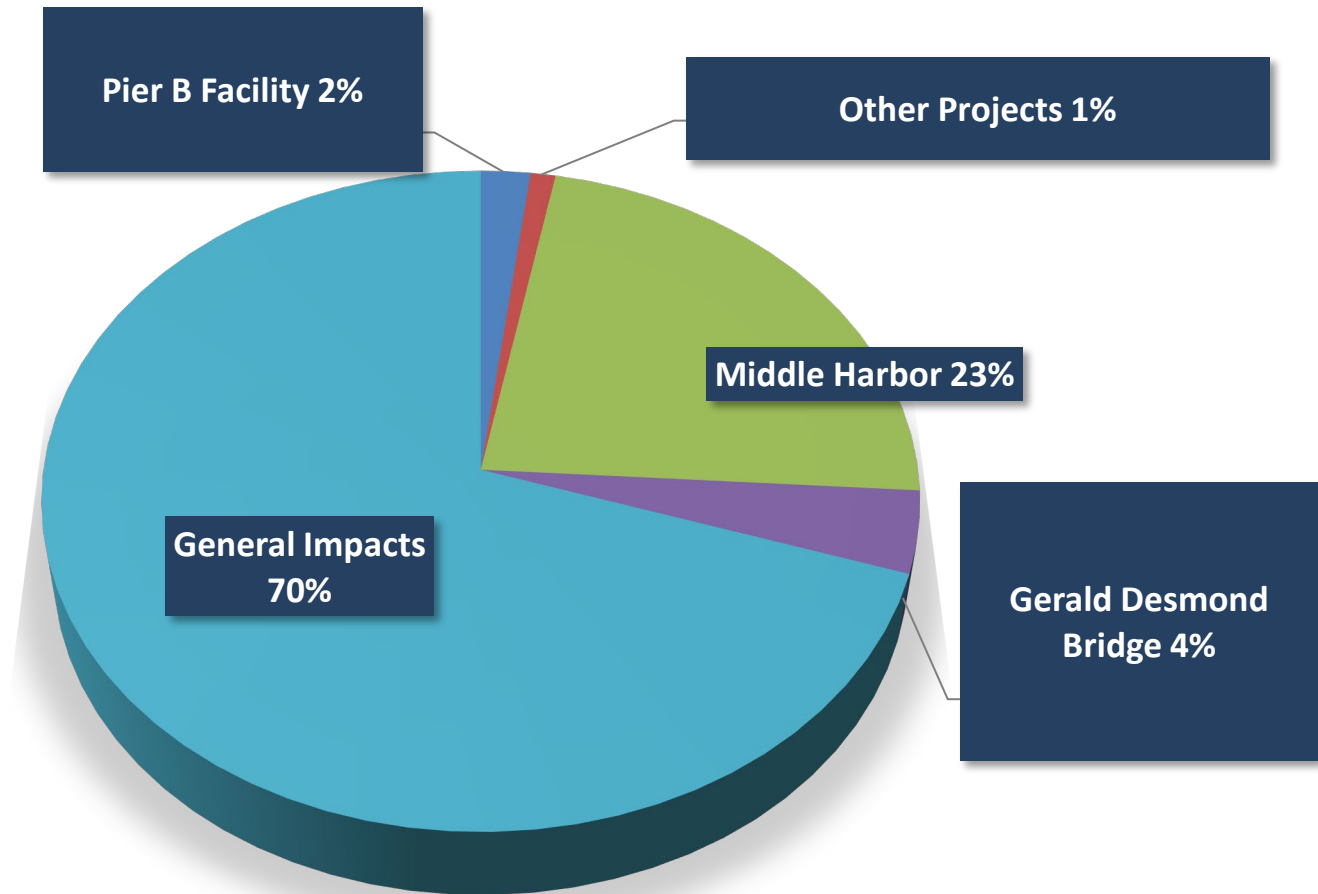
Instead, its revenues come from leasing marine terminals.

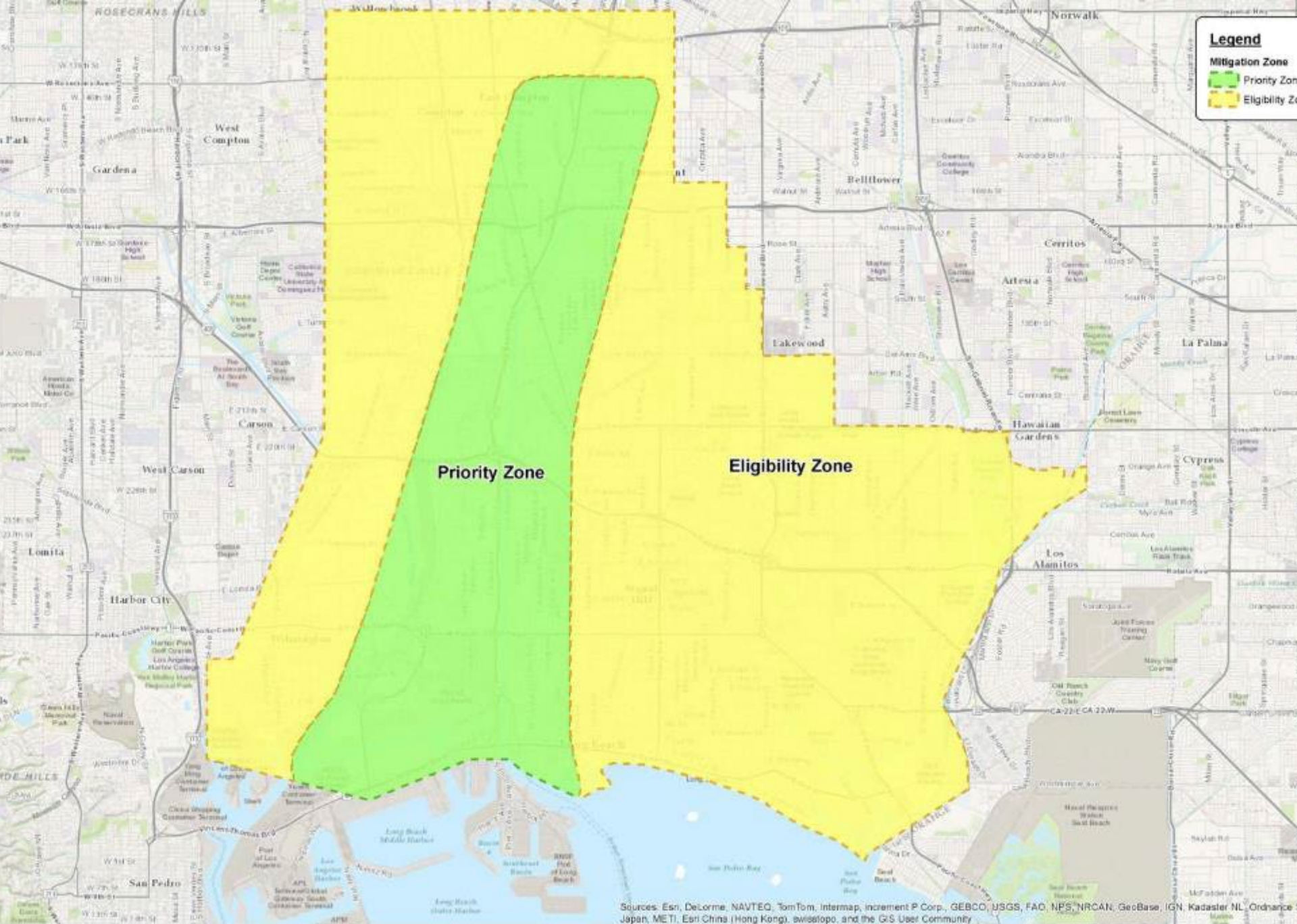

Eligible Projects

- Air filtration and HVAC
- Parks and open space
- Trees and landscaping
- Healthcare programs
- Energy efficiency upgrades
- Solar water heating
- Solar generation
- Electric transportation
- Sound walls/noise barriers
- Bicycling/pedestrian projects
- Traffic-calming measures
- Water quality and stormwater projects



Community Health Program

Reduce exposure to or alleviate the health impacts associated with port-related air pollution by supporting health programs or services that reach children, pregnant women, senior citizens, the chronically ill, and people with respiratory/cardiopulmonary illnesses and impairments.



Eligibility Criteria

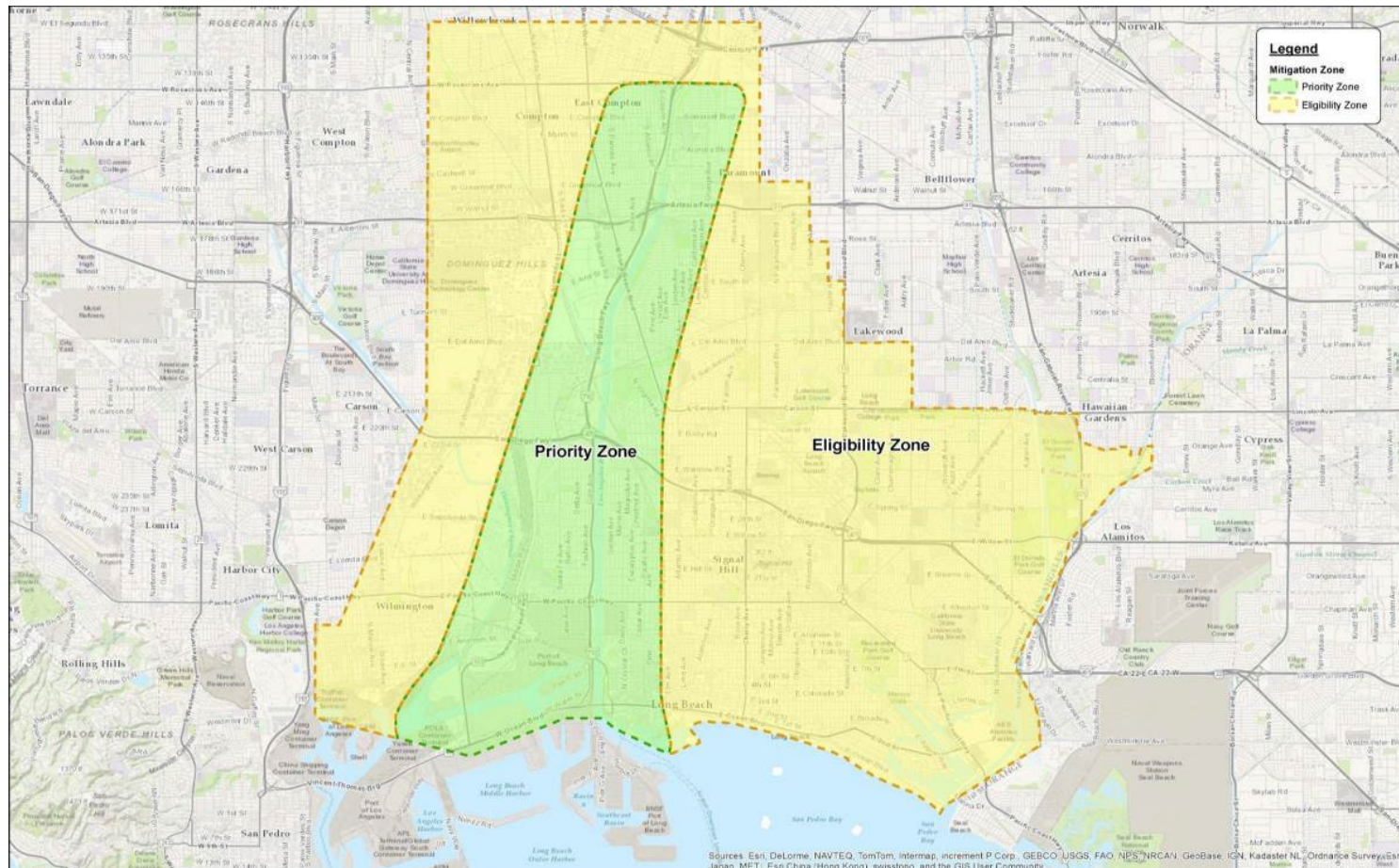
Eligible Projects

- Health projects and services designed to reduce the risks associated with asthma and other respiratory and/or cardiopulmonary ailments.
- These projects may include services such as screening and diagnosis, case management, education, training community health workers or medical personnel, and outreach.

Eligible Applicants

- Government agency OR 501(c)3 non-profit organization that provides health education, outreach or services OR a licensed health care provider such as a hospital or clinic
- AND serve eligible populations
- Consortia (partnerships) are eligible and strongly encouraged
