We are proud to continue building on the progress we've made to the coastal experience, but we know we can do more. With you input, we have a chance to really reenergize the experience at our beaches for both our residents and our visitors.

In addition to the proposed building renovations, the public will be able to review proposed conceptual plans for adding play and exercise locations adjacent to the Concession Buildings.

As I said, there's a lot more to come on improvements to our miles of beach. We are in the second year of the Army Corps of Engineers' study on the Breakwater. By the end of this year we will see possible design options for the Breakwater, and we will want your voice heard then too.
