PARKS, RECREATION & MARINE STRATEGIC PLAN UPDATE



STRATEGIC PLAN PROGRESS INCLUDES SILVERADO SKATE PARK RENOVATION, AGENTS OF DISCOVERY EDUCATIONAL APP AND GAUCHO GRILL BEACH CONCESSION STAND AT ALAMITOS BEACH

During the first quarter of 2024 many projects and initiatives have helped to make progress on the goals of the Parks,

Recreation and Marine (PRM) Strategic Plan. The plan is guiding PRM's operational, staffing and budget decisions for a 10-year period from 2022 to 2032 and is serving as a tool to adapt park services as the community's needs evolve. Some of the first quarter highlights are:

PROVIDE SAFE, ACCESSIBLE PUBLIC SPACES. Marine Maintenance staff made several critical repairs including storm related damage in Shoreline Marina on Dock A to continue to intake new permittees and supply free public access to pump out stations. Staff also replaced 3 Beach Public Restroom doors in Basin-3 RR.

Beach Maintenance staff handled the storm season fortification of Peninsula Beach berm to safeguard lives and property during a heavy storm season, and collected and disposed of nearly 1,400 tons of debris. Staff installed a new pump and PVC piping for the fill outfall in the Rainbow Lagoon.

OFFER MEANINGFUL RECREATION PROGRAMMING AND EVENTS. Agents of Discovery is an educational mobile gaming platform app using augmented reality to get youth active outdoors. PRM developed "missions" for the app that are free to play and engage users in learning about park sites through fun challenges. In addition to missions at DeForest, Willow Springs and MacArthur Parks, staff designed a mission at the El Dorado Regional Park and Nature Center is set to launch by summer 2024.

BUILD INNOVATIVE AND LASTING PARTNERSHIPS.

PRM partnered with ASK (Action Sports Kids), a Long Beach-based nonprofit Foundation to renovate the Silverado Park Skate Park. ASK raised \$160,000 for construction and held three rounds of meetings with the kids who use the Skate Park for their input. The park was upgraded with longer-lasting concrete elements, and a new grind rail.

PRM partnered with The Over Under Initiative, Inc. (OUI) which is a nonprofit corporation dedicated to increasing access to sports by developing multiuse sport courts. OUI secured a Sports Matter grant, valued at \$30,000, from the Dick's Sporting Goods Foundation to install a Goalpher system on the full basketball court at Veterans Park, which will give park users the option of playing soccer or basketball.

EENSURE A DYNAMIC AND DIVERSE WORKFORCE. Job bulletins were opened to hire four Marine Agent I-IIIs and seasonal summer employees. Community Recreation Services staff held a Job Fair in January for attendees to apply to open positions and participate in interviews on site. During the first quarter, staff planned an job fair for older adults to take place at the Long Beach Senior Center as part of Older Americans Month in May.

CREATE A FINANCIALLY SECURE AND RESILIENT OPER- ATION. A 94 percent occupancy rate was maintained for all marinas. Marine Operations staff continued to schedule, inspect and onboard vessels for new permits.

We are pleased to announce Kelly Armstrong as PRM's new Beach Maintenance Superintendent! Kelly joined PRM over 19 years ago, starting as a Recreation Leader/Specialist III-NC in the Aquatics Day Camps in 2004. After being promoted twice within the Recreation Leader career ladder, he transferred to the Beach Maintenance Division, starting out as a Maintenance Assistant I-NC in 2009. Since then, Kelly has been promoted to Equipment Operator II (2012), Equipment Operator III (2015), and Park Maintenance Supervisor (2016). Most recently, Kelly had assumed the Beach Maintenance Superintendent position on an interim basis beginning in December 2023. Kelly's career growth and success are evidenced by his commitment to hard work and dedication to our organization. His abundance of institutional knowledge made him an excellent candidate for the permanent Beach Maintenance Superintendent role. Congratulations Kelly!

This year's Sowing the Seeds 5th Annual Fundraising Event for the Partners of Park will be the final special gathering of the POP Board and community supporters of our non-profit partner to express our appreciation for the half decade of successful leadership by outgoing Executive Director Trinka Rowsell. Major accomplishments of Partners of Parks under Trinka's leadership include a new Strategic Plan, expanded board representation, increases to the scholarship programs, and the funding of the replacement of the Admiral Kidd Park Playground. The search for a new Executive Director is underway with interviews of top candidates under consideration to be scheduled before Summer.

As April helps us bid farewell to winter and usher in the spectacular seasonal beauty of SoCal springtime, I hope you will be able to enjoy our parks, beaches, and engaging programs and special events. Parks Make Long Beach...Parks Make Life Better!




